To all to whom Presents shall come, Greeting :

KNOW YE, that a part of bulficate
No 1364 dated 11th day of January 1813 issued
by the People of West Tennessee to William
of Lewis and on the 14th day of September
1814 by

There is granted by the said State Tennessee, unto William Thomas

A certain tract or parcel of Land containing ten acres, by Survey

made on the 30th day of December 1814 lying in Warren
County in the second District on the head waters of Hickory
Creek in the hands of one as recorded as follows to wit Bound
north and east by the West from the South West
corner of a forty acre survey on the West side of
six poles to two sugar trees and a line of Cypress on
the mountain thence with the line of the same North fifty
five degrees East to a stake in the line of the ten acre survey
aforesaid thence West fifty poles to the Beginning

With the hereditaments and appurtenances. To have and to hold the
said tract or parcel of Land, with appurtenances to the said William
Thomas and his heirs forever.

In Witness whereof, JOSEPH MINN, Governor of the State of
Tennessee, hath hereunto set his hand and caused the great seal of the
state to be affixed, at Knoxville on the 13th day of May
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, and
of the Independence of the United States, the fortieth.
