Know all men by these presents, that we Johnathan
Wootton and Wife Elizabeth Wootton for and in consideration
of the love we bear for the cause of Christ, and from
an earnest desire to promote his kingdom on earth, do
give and grant and by these presents convey unto
Wm. H. Gusk, J. Pence Braley, John Adams, James B.
Wootton and James Reay, trustees; a certain lot of
land situated as follows: In the first civil district
of Grundy County in Tennessee, on the waters of
Hickery creek, and bounded as follows:— Beginning in
the center of Hickery Creek at the crossing of the
Altamont and Manchester road, at the N. E. corner
of the school-house lot, running with the said ^{road} South of
East to the center of said Creek opposite a bending
Hickery tree which stands on its right or North bank
near a black-smith shop; thence down the said Creek
with its meanderings to the beginning corner, and
containing by estimation threefourths of an acre, more
or less. And the said premises shall be used,
kept, maintained, and disposed of as a place of Divine
worship, for the use of the an ^{city} and men

of the Methodist Episcopal Church South— On condi-
 tion that, a house of worship be built on said land by
 the first day of January 1887. — Subject to the discipline,
 usage, and ministerial appointments of said Church,
 as from time to time authorized and declared by
 the General Conference of said Church, and the Annual
 Conference within whose bounds the said premises are
 situated. To have and to hold said three fourths of
 an acre of land, unto the trustees and their successors
 in office forever, We covenant and agree that we are
 lawfully possessed of said land, and have a good right
 to convey and that the same is unincumbered, and
 we further agree to warrant and defend the title of said
 land, unto the said trustees and their successors
 forever, in office, against the lawful claims of all
 persons whatever.
