The Grundy County
Historical Society
operates from a tiny
room dubbed the "Root
Cellar." What they have
accomplished however, is
of immense importance to
every person in this
county.

Fantastic things often spring from one one small idea. So it was with the Grundy County Historical Society.

If any one person is to be credited with the idea which spawned the local group it would have to be the late Renice Curtis, according to Anna Goforth, who serves as the group's secretary. The group recognized Mrs. Curtis's efforts in their first newsletter. Her interest in local history probably peaked in her latter years when she published an obituary book, Deaths and

Funerals of Grundy County.

Thus began the thirst for local history. The Grundy County Historical Society was organized on Feb. 22, 1988. There were seven charter members including officers Amedia Conry, president; Inez Winton, secretary; Clydene Douglas, treasurer. Other charter members were Anna Goforth, Renice Curtis, Boots Hunziker and Madge Baggenstoss. The society began with initial funds of \$195.70. The ladies raised that amount with

a bake and book sale.
"In the years since, we have worked to establish a genealogy library and to preserve historic records of Grundy County. A room in the Tracy City library, 'The Root Cellar" houses our collection of genealogical material, Census books and historical references were purchased or donated We published a book called

Reminiscence, a collection of interviews with Tracy City citizens. We began organizing old court records stored in the attic of the Grundy County Courthouse, but completed only a small part of this project before the courthouse burned in 1990. The surviving records were sent to the state archives and placed on microfilm, " President Katherine Flury said in the first issue of The Pathfinder, the newsletter edited by Anna Goforth.

The cover for **The Pathfinder**, a quarterly publication, was designed by Mona G.

Moreland of Duncan, OK.

Mona, the daughter of Mrs. Goforth, serves as co-editor of the newsletter. "Her help is invaluable to me. I just couldn't do it all without her," the editor said. The two communicate by e-mail, a skill Mrs. Goforth acquired after she

received a used computer as a gift. Her new computer skills are invaluable in keeping up with historical records and research.

The historical society's newsletter is professional. "Our first attempt at producing a newsletter was a learning experience," Mrs. Goforth said. Issues have included articles from county historian William Ray Turner, historian Margaret Coppinger and John E. Sweeton, among many others. Turner and Mrs. Coppinger have been more than generous in sharing their expertise in local history with the group. "They help us so much," said Mrs. Goforth. The group may have started with only a few members but like other "roots,"- they have grown and need room to expand. Now the historical society has its own web page and 130 members. "The web page lets us hear from all over the country. We have queries from everywhere," Mrs. Goforth said. So remember, if you need information about family roots, you can find it at the "Root Cellar" or on the historical society's web page in Computer Topics. The group meets each second Wednesday of the month at the library. Come on down, you'll find a warm welcome.

A House and It's Occupants--The James O'Neill House

The James O'Neill House sits at the top of a hill in Tracy City, at the corner of Coke and Colyar overlooking the old Railroad Heading. The house has an interesting history dating back to Civil War times, and has been home to five generations of family and friends.

In 1863, while the Civil War was in full force, the Federal troops took control of Tracy City. The white house on the hill was confiscated for their headquarters. A curfew was put into effect and none of the local citizens were allowed out of their homes after dark. As a young woman, Miss Viola Kelley's grandmother broke the curfew and went to a local store after dusk, leaving her newborn infant at home. She was captured by the Yankees, taken to their headquarters at the O'Neill House, and held until morning. Her baby was fed a sugar tit for nourishment while its mother was incarcerated at the Federal's headquarters.

After the Federal troops moved on toward Chattanooga, the Confederate troops came in on a train. Mr. Robert Baggenstoss had an old photograph of the Confederate troops and the train; the O'Neill House can be seen in the background. The Confederates also used the house as their headquarters. Thus, prisoners from both the Blue and the Gray were held in the cellar of the O'Neill House. In April of 1865, when Abraham Lincoln was assassinated, Mr. James O'Neill attended Lincoln's funeral, which was by invitation only.

In 1869, Louisa B. Roddy committed suicide at the house by drowning herself in a large cistern. She was buried in City Cemetery on June 19. Her suicide note is engraved on her tombstone, "Farewell vain world I have had enough of thee, I value not what thou cans't say of me."

In 1870, the Tennessee Coal and Railroad Company brought convicts from Nashville to Tracy City to work the coal mines and coke ovens. The O'Neill House was used as a stockade for incoming or unruly prisoners. They were kept in the cellar until taken to the stockade located in The Heading. Great-grandfather O'Neill was the overseer of the stockade. In 1889, he, along with Mr. A.S.Colyar and Dr. R.F. Keyes, attended the National Prison Association meeting in Nashville, where they were instrumental in getting small children separated from older and more hardened criminals.

The historical O'Neill House still stands. The wooden door at the front is original, and the glass above it cannot be dated. The flooring is original, and in the course of remodeling several

hidden doors and windows were discovered. The cedar stair rail going from the main floor to the upstairs was made by prisoners. The upstairs is still covered with horse hair plaster, and the two levels are held together with wooden pegs. In two rooms, the corner posts are made of trees. The iron door to the prison cell in the cellar is long gone, but the brass key remains.

Oh, yes! Though there have never been any reports of ghosts or goblins at the O'Neill House, a former Grundy County Sheriff did state that he couldn't be paid enough to visit the cellar again!

James O'Neill was born in Baltimore, Maryland. He came to Tennessee in 1860, and married Emma Street in 1879. They had two daughters::

- 1. Elizabeth B. O'Neill--she never married. She died in 1904.
- 2. Viola O'Neill --she married H.C. Haynes. They had two sons: James O'Neill Haynes and Edward Francis "Toots" Haynes

Viola died in 1914. In 1930 James O'Neill died and in 1933 his wife Emma died.

At their death the house was left to their son-in-law, H. C. Haynes. He had remarried to Ollie May Argo. She died in 1945 and H.C. Haynes died in 1963. At his death he left the house to his living son Edward (Viola's child) and to his son by Ollie Argo, they in turn signed the house over to Mary Hall Haynes, the widow of James O'Neill Haynes. James had died in 1936. Mary in turn signed the house over to her daughter, Margaret. Mary continued to live there for the rest of her life. In 1963 Mary married Bill Griswold and he, too, lived there until his death. In 1979 Margaret Cook came back to the house and still resides there. At her death the house will belong to her two daughters and at their deaths it will become the property of her grandson, Terry Fults.

If walls could talk they would tell you that this has been home to relatives of the Streets, Haynes, Carricks, Argos, Halls, Cooks and Bains. These were not visitors but actually lived in the house with the owners at the time. A few years ago when a new roof had to be installed one of the roofers was a minister. He was asked to bless the house and to let the doors always be open to those in need of a kind word or a decent meal. May God forever grant this prayer.

Elizabeth TUCKER married Joseph LAWSON, 5-4-1851, and then married William CAMPBELL, 12-9-1858. Relationship of these children to Rhoda is not known.)
- Elizabeth ADAMS, 54, born GA; William W., 21, born unk. (Did William marry Talitha Emely THOMAS, daughter of James, 8-13-1866? In 1880: William, 51; Tabitha, 30; Jasper K., 15; Martha A., 12; Nancy E., 8; Telitha J., 4; Rhoda F., 4; Malinda, 1; Marinda, 1.)
- Alexander TUCKER, 45, laborer, born unk; Martha, 25; Mary, 9. (Is this the same family? In 1860: Alex, 59, born SC; Martha, 21; Nancy J., 4. In 1870: Alex, 67; Martha, 57; Nancy, 14. Nancy J. married John WATLEY, 8-4-1878, and in 1880, John is 37 and Nancy J. is 25. In 1880, Alemond TUCKER is 76 and has "arecepalus" and his wife, Martha, is 61.)
- John THOMAS, 30, farmer; Matilda, 28; William C., 8; Martha A., 4; Mary F., 2; James H., 6/12. (In 1860, there is no Martha A. and additional children: Jonathan, 8; Nancy I., 5; Samuel, 3. Jonathan married Mary MORAN, 2-8-1868. In the will of Peter MORAN, 1893, he mentions daughter, Mary THOMAS. In 1870, Jonathan and Mary have Mary, 1, and William, 2/12.)
- James BELL, 75, chairmaker, born NC; Andrew BLANCHET, 21; Mary Ann BLANCHET, 20; Thomas J. BLANCHET, 1.
- 124/127 Littleberry STONE, 32, gatekeeper on turnpike; Arcinit, 24; Martha Jane, 4; John, 1.
- Jonathan THOMAS, 63, farmer, born SC; Nancy, 63, born SC; David, 23; Robert C., 19. (Jonathan and Nancy not found after this census. There are 2 marriages for David THOMAS: to Manurvy C. SANDERS, 3-21-1863, and to Elizabeth DYRE, 5-8-1870. In 1870: David, 45; Eliza, 35; William, 1/12; Malissa DYER, 11. Archibald TUCKER married Elizabeth THOMAS, 7-3-1850, and in 1870, are living next door to David THOMAS family: Archibald, 40; Eliza, 41; D. T., 19; William, 17; Newton, 14; S. H., 10; Normandy, 5; Nancy THOMAS, 74, born SC; Robert THOMAS, 38. Perhaps this Nancy THOMAS is the widow of Jonathan. By 1880, David and Elizabeth THOMAS have added children: Nancy, 7; Archibald, 5; Arthur, 2. Malissa J. DYER or THOMAS, 18, is still with this family.)

- James THOMAS, 36, farmer, born GA; Marinda, 36, born GA; Sarah, ---/129 14, born GA; Nancy, 12, born GA; Martha, 10, born GA; Meredith, 8, born GA; Samantha E., 7, born GA; Tellitha, 5, born AL; Eliza, 3, born AL. (James married Mary TUCKER, 2-4-1855, and in 1860: James, 50; Mary, 20; Talitha, 15; Eliza, 14; Rhoda, 11; Franklin, 3. In 1870, added children: James, 11; David, 9; George, 3; Allie, 5; Margaret, 1/12. By 1880, Allie is called Algora and these are added to this family: Mary, 7; John, 5; Fanny, 2; Julia A. DYER, 72, widow; George DYER, 13. Nancy married John ADAMS, 3-11-1862, and in 1870: John, 53; Nancy, 36; James, 18; Jerry, 16; Benjamin, 13; Margaret, 11; John, 3. Martha married Preston LAYNE, 5-2-1859 and in 1860, Nancy THOMAS, 22, is with them, and in 1870, they have Henderson, 5. Samantha E. is probably the S. E. THOMAS who married Isaac LAYNE, 12-15-1860. Talitha married William ADAMS, 8-13-1866. Rhoda married George W. DYRE, 5-6-1870.)

(By 1860, Harris and Nancy have Elizabeth, 5, and Malinda, 2. B. F. married Catherine GOODMAN, 10-7-1858, and in 1860, have Margaret E., 7/12. Martin married Emeline G. PATTON, 9-27-1859, and by 1870, have Martin, 6, and Peter, 2. Mary H. married G. W. GARNER, 2-16-1867. Eliza married John W. GOODMAN, 10-22-1865, and in 1870, they have William T., 3, and S. P., 2. William married Josephine PATTON, 10-1-1873, and in 1880, they have Nancy E., 5, John B., 3, and Alley M., 1. In 1870, next door to son, Samuel and family, are Harris, 62; Nancy, 58; William, 22; Sarah, 20; Bettie, 13; Malinda, 11. In "Tennessee Civil War Veterans Questionnaires". Samuel and William completed the forms about their service in the Confederate Army. They also mentioned B. F. GILLIAM, probably their brother. They said their mother was Nancy REED, daughter of Isaac.)
- 127/131 Green B. COLDWELL, 40, farmer. (G. B. COLDWELL married Sarah MORGAN, 9-3-1854, and Sarah COLDWELL married John WEAVER, 10-25-1855. In GC Wills & Estates, 1857, Green is deceased and his widow in Sarah WEAVER.)
- Robert J. ADAMS, 27, farmer, born NC; Frances J., 27. (In 1860, Robert and Frances have James H., 8, and Andrew J., 3. Is this the Robert ADAMS who married Mary STONESTREET, 2-16-1868? In 1870, Robert, 41 or 47?; Mary, 24; James 18; John, 16; William, 1.)
- James BRANDON, 45, wagonmaker, born SC; Elizabeth, 43; Margaret, 18; Dorothy, 14; William, 10; Rebecca, 7; Isaac, 3.
- 130/134 William STIGGALL, 31, wagonmaker; Elizabeth, 30, born AL; Sarah, 14; Stephen, 13; Pelethe Ann, 11; Araminda, 9; Nancy Jane, 8; Rebecca A., 5; John A., 3; Charles A., 1.

By 1870, William, 9, and Daniel, 8, are added to this family. John married Margaret SMITH, 9-20-1878, and in 1880, they have Andrew, 10/12. Martha H. married John W. SMITH, 11-19-1871, and in 1880: John, 28; Martha, 31; Daniel, 7; John, 6; James, 2. Sarah A. married T. S. ALLEN, 3-12-1880, and in 1880 census: Thomas, 42; S. A., 37; Mary A. PATTERSON, 13, step-daughter; William J. PATTERSON, 12, step-son; Thomas PATTERSON, 9, step-son. Is this the same family? In her will, 16 April 1891, Mary PATTERSON leaves "land on Pelham road" to son, William, and daughter, Mary.)

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The 1850 census of Grundy County, Tennessee, was enumerated by Michael HOOVER and W. H. THOMPSON. Mr Hoover's part is first and he used Dwelling/Family numbers 1/1 through 292/293. Then there are Mr. Thompson's enumerations using Dwelling/Family numbers 1/1 through 143/147. For the purposes of this Index, Mr. Thompson's numbers are shown in parentheses. Example: Dwelling/Family number 1/1, William S. MOONEY, is at the beginning of the report; Dwelling/Family number (1/1), Alfred Fults, is found after Dwelling/Family number 292/293, Nathan Fults.

This Index covers only Heads of Households and other persons residing in a home where the head of the household had a different surname.

Men of Grundy County: County Historian William Ray Turner

Edited by Katie Goforth

William Ray Turner, a collector of Grundy County History, was born in Tracy City, Tennessee on February 1, 1926, to Walter and Annie McCreary Turner. He collected his first material on Grundy County while in the eighth grade at Shook School in 1940. He has been collecting ever since. He has always enjoyed history, and at one time considered collecting Tennessee histories. However, "knowing that more educated people could do a better job on Tennessee history", and having a love of Grundy County, he decided to collect Grundy County histories instead.

When William Ray first began his research in the '40's, people had been saying that Tracy City was named after an outlaw. Although there was an outlaw named Harry Tracy, he had nothing to do with Tracy City! William Ray learned that Tracy City was actually named for Samuel Franklin Tracy, the first president of the Sewanee Mining Company. Mr. Tracy was from New York, and his company opened the first coal mine in Grundy County in 1858.

Many of the Turners are collectors. William Ray's brother, James, has been collecting things ever since he was a youngster. William Ray's two sons, Larry and Travis, have also caught the collecting "bug". William Ray, with his son Travis and some hired help, built what he likes to call The Grundy County History Museum next to his home near Tracy City. He just completed an addition to the museum, which houses some 17,000 pictures, Grundy County newspapers dating back to the 1890's, several thousand copies of Grundy County marriage licenses, old maps, deeds, high school annuals, and bank records. There's a vast array of coal mining artifacts from the "pick and shovel" days, including miners' dinner pails, company records, scrip, and jingles. Other interesting artifacts include an old printing press once used by Mr. and Mrs. Scott Crutchfield, a Knights of Pythias ceremonial robe, a K.K.K. robe, and the old metal tabs once used on plug and twist tobacco.


William Ray has written and collaborated on several publications of the historical type. In 1943 and 1944, he wrote local articles for *The Chattanooga News-Free Press*. He assisted Allan "Juke" Shook and Jasper Arbuckle, Jr. with their book, *The Mountain Goat*, which is the story of the railroad from Cowan to Palmer, the men who ran the engines and worked the railroad tracks. He also helped "in a small way", he says, with a book by Karin A. Shapiro entitled *A New South Rebellion--The Battle Against Convict Labor in the Tennessee Coal Fields, 1871-1896*. He helped Mrs. Doris Lawrence Sweeney of California compile her family history entitled *Our Kind of People From A to Z.* He assisted historian Jim Nicholson with two publications--*The Grundy County History Tabloids* (1976), and *Grundy* (1982). Recently William Ray wrote a section about Grundy County for the *Tennessee Encyclopedia* published by The Tennessee Historical Society.

William Ray's distinction as a historian and collector is widely recognized. He has appeared on several Chattanooga and Nashville television programs talking about Grundy's history and showing his collection. Articles about him and his museum have been picked up by the Associated Press and published in newspapers all over the country.

Some of the articles have been seen by people who have visited his museum, and they sent him copies from their own newspapers. A group of outdoor writers once visited him, and one wrote back later to say that her article about him and his history collection had been published in 43 states and seven foreign countries!

William Ray is proud of his unique collection, and is very grateful to all who have contributed to it. "I could not have had this collection," William Ray says, "without the help of people who donated different items or let me copy their old photos. I cannot name all the people because there have been many and from many different states. It's amazing how many people from other states contribute to my collection. People who have something connected to Grundy County that they send me, and the many people originally from Grundy County who now live--or some of their family lives--in other states."

William Ray Turner's fascinating Grundy County History Museum is located next to his home at 3066 Brown's Hollow Road, Tracy City, Tennessee.

## My Trip to Monteagle

by Emma Octavia Winton

(This charming little account of a summer trip to Grundy County was written by Emma Octavia Winton while still a school girl; born in 1877, Emma made the trip either in 1889, when only 12, or in 1895 (she married William Henry Ashley in 1897). These dates were extrapolated from a universal calendar since she did not give the year in her manuscript. It must have been in 1889, before the riots began at the Tracy City coal mine operations. According to Ike Woodward's booklet, "Tracy City from 1893 to 1910" as reprinted in part in the Grundy County Herald's special issue of September 2, 1976, the stockade housed the convict labor force which worked the coke ovens and was located near the present Grundy Lakes. Another article in that issue says that "the stockade was burned to the ground" August 13, 1892, and the convicts sent to Nashville. The latter article also said that there was a second stockade. The several years of trouble which took place on the mountain formed a very dark chapter of the history of Grundy County (and Tennessee), which cannot begin to be discussed here. Ragardless, it would seem to preclude any sensible person (such as the mine owner) from taking young girls on a sight-seeing trip through the mine, much less through the convicts' quarters--making 1889 a more likely date than 1895 for her excursion.)

* * *

On July 17 accompanied by two other girls and one young man, I started for a short pleasure trip to a beautiful point on the grand old Cumberland Mts. known as Monteagle. We reached Tullahoma (from Manchester) around 4 oclock and remained there about two hours during which time we strolled around, taking in the sight seeing places of the town. We were very glad indeed when the arrival of our train was announced about six oclock. We then sped along at a rapid rate until we reached Cowan just as it was getting dark. We waited there about 20 minutes for our Monteagle train. While there we ate our lunch which was very refreshing and when the train pulled out we all found we were ready for a little fun before we reached our journey's end. There being a good supply of coaches, we happened to the good luck of getting in a coach in which there was only about half a dozen beside our crowd so we felt at liberty to take advantage of the situation and just imagine the fun we had. The scenery up the Mt. was beautiful at night. We were continually going around curves and could look out of our window most any time and the sparks from the engine would almost transform night into day. Ofcourse, we had to move along very slowly which was not at all objectionable as we could take every thing in better. We reached our destination at 9:30 oclock and immediately went to our place of boarding which was a neat little cottage rented for the season by two ladies. During most (of) the time I was there, there were 9 girls in the cottage and ofcourse this made every thing pleasant as we all were alone and had no one to throw any (as found) restraint over us. On Thursday the 18th we attended Talmages's lecture on "The Tour around the World" which ofcourse was grand. During the days of the week we had a number of places to go to, such as the kindergarten, ten pen alley. school lectures, tennis court, & etc. In the latter part of the day every one attended twilight prayers and then down to the amp(hi)theater where we could always hear splendid lectures.

#### (My Trip to Monteagle continued.)

The most enjoyable day I spent while there was at Tracy City. Early Saturday morn, 5 girls of our crowd and one young man started for Tracy. We drove out to the mines and first went all through the stockade. We were treated very kindly and shown through every apartment. The place is by no means attractive and no one can help from extending a heart full of sympathy to the poor convicts. The most pitiful sight I saw was when we walked into one of the rooms, there lay a mere boy on his couch with an innocent face with his bible by his side. I must not dwell on this any longer but hasten on. We next went down to one of the mines owned by a Mr. Hargis. He was awfully nice to us and took us in his coal boxes drawn by the little mule and carried us a mile in the mine. Ofcourse, we had to take the picks and dig some to have it said we had dug in the mines. The atmosphere in there was delightful and were not very anxious to leave as it was very hot and oppressive out side. We found a number of fossils while in there which looked very natural. Time came for our departure and we took our seats in the boxes and the little mule went flying along with us bringing us safely to our starting point. We then went down among the coke ovens and then started back for Mont Eagle with a ravenous appetite and carried away with our trip to Tracy. On Monday I started for home, thus ending one of the most pleasant weeks I ever spent away from home. I would advise all pleasure seekers to make at least one trip to Mont Eagle and be sure and make a flying trip to Tracy.



# CHEROKEE BY BLOOD by Jerry Wright Jordan (Submitted by Jacine Denton)

22579. IRVIN P. GREEN and 4 children, Wartrace, Tenn.

Rejected. Claimant, his father and grandfather were born in Warren County, Tenn. remote from the Cherokee domain. Their names do not appear on the rolls of 1835 nor 1851. Claimant's great grandfather, the ancestor whom he alleges Cherokee descent was but a 1/4 Cherokee, born in 1777, and died in Warren Co., Tenn. 1861. His name Absobom (sic) Brown, does not appear on the rolls of 1835 or 51, and there is no evidence to show that he ever lived with the tribe or was recognized as being a member of the tribe at the time of the treaty of 1835-6 or since. Nor does it appear that Irwin P. Green, or his ancestors back to Absolom Brown were ever thus recognized.



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#### Women of Grundy County: Dola Schild Tylor by Anna G. Goforth

In March of 1996 the Grundy County Historical Society printed the first issue of our newsletter, The Pathfinder. Copies were mailed to people interested in genealogy and especially to Grundy County residents, locally and out of the county. One of the first responses received was from a former resident of Gruetli, Dola Schild Tylor. She has been one of our most loyal and supportive members ever since.

Dola has contributed books, family histories, census records, other material and funds to The Root Cellar. The most important item, in my opinion, is the series on "Neighbors in Grundy County, 1880", the census records of that year. The series is a treasure for researchers.

Dola Virginia Schild was born 5 February, 1915 in Gruetli, Grundy County, Tennessee. Her ancestors were some of the residents of what is known as The Swiss Colony, settled by people from Switzerland in the late 1860's.

She was the daughter of Christian Peter and Ethel (Tate) Schild, of Gruetli. She is often asked where the name Dola came from. Her aunt, Elsie Schild, named her after her best friend, Dola Hamby, who said the name was two notes of the musical scale: do, re, mi, fa, so, la, ti, do.

Dola graduated from Grundy County High School in 1933 and from the University of Tennessee in 1958. In the 20 years between sophomore and junior years in college, she worked as a map draftsman with Lone Star Gas Company, Dallas, with a geophysical company searching for oil under the Pacific Ocean, at Santa Barbara, California, and as a statistical draftsman with TVA, Chattanooga. At the end of W.W.II, she transferred to the US Army Corps of Engineers, on Okinawa, where she spent most of the next 31 years. Her only sibling, Roy, graduated from the University of Tennessee in 1950 and joined the Corps of Engineers on Okinawa the same year. Both Dola and Roy were married on Okinawa, Dola to Richard Robert Tylor of Chicago, in 1949, and Roy to Hideko Kinjo of Okinawa, in 1953.

In the mid 1970's, the Corps of Engineers set up a new office in Winchester, Virginia, to be headquarters for the work they were doing in Saudi Arabia. Roy and Richard transferred to the Winchester office in 1976-77, and Dola retired.

For the last 20 years, she has been a volunteer in the Archives of the Handley Library in Winchester, and has published 6 books of Winchester city records.

We are pleased to honor Dola as one of our "Women of Grundy County."


