PREFACE

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THE PATHFINDER, Volumes II, No. 3, 1997, through Volumes IV, No. 1, 1999, gave "Neighbors in Grundy County - 1850". These were residents that the census taker found in Grundy County, June 1850. Research was done on these families through the censuses of 1860, 1870, and 1880.

In "New Neighbors in Grundy County - 1860" are about 100 families who became residents of our county <u>after</u> June 1850 and were still there in June 1860. The main sources of information for this project are the microfilm copies of the 1850 and 1880 censuses, the 1860 and 1870 censuses as read and published by Goins & Hobbs of Dunlap, and by Sistlers, of Nashville, and "Grundy County Earliest Deeds, 1852-1867" by Charles A. Sherrill.

On the following page is the map on which Mr. Sherrill shows his estimates of the 8 Civil Districts of the county, 1844-1860. He also gives an excerpt from Grundy County Court Minute Book "C", 6 Feb 1860, in which commissioners Wm. C. Hill, W. H. Humble and A. Coulston give this description of new 9th and 10th Districts of the county:

9th Dist. Beginning at the southwest corner of district number seven thence northwardly with the lines of the seventh and eith [sic] districts of the County line. Thence southwardly with the various meanders of the County line to the beginning. This shall be the ninth district & the voting place shall be at Pelham.

 $10 \, \mathrm{th}$ Dist. Beginning at the northeast corner of district number six. Thence with the line of the same & the lines of the seventh eighth first second third fourth & fifth districts to the beginning. This shall be the tenth district & the voting place shall be at Altamont.


In June 1860, the census taker added District 11 - Altamont, a small area with only eleven families.

John, 63, born NC; Martha, 40; Albert HANNER, 30, born NC. (In 1850, Sumner County: John ARMFIELD, 48, born NC; Martha, 35, born NC; Mary POINDEXTER, 30; Wm. MURRY, 25; Albert HANNER, 20, and these HANNER children: John, 7; Adel, 4; Edwin, 3. John ARMFIELD is in many early Grundy County deeds. On 7 Dec 1854, John FRENCH sold to John ARMFIELD, for \$3750, "the Beersheba Springs tract". In May 1855, ARMFIELD, of Sumner County, bought 200 acres for \$1, land "not far from Beersheba Springs". The last mention of ARMFIELD in Grundy County Deed Books "A", "B", & "C": Oct 1860, ARMFIELD and Thomas HARDING, trustees, receive the hotel of about 150 rooms, including all furnishings down to nut crackers and finger bowls. In 1870, John ARMFIELD, 63, retired farmer; Martha, 55. Living with them is the black family of Nathan and Henretta FRANKLIN and 6 children. In the Cemetery near Assembly Grounds, Beersheba Springs: John ARMFIELD, died Sept 20 1871, aged 74 years.)

BAGGOTT, District 11, Altamont

SMITH is sold at auction and is "land on which John S. BAGGOTT lives". BAGGOTT is not found in Tennessee, 1870.)

PARKS, adjacent Big Road leading up Hollingsworth's Cove across the mountain. This seems to be the same family in 1870: John BABER, 54, born TN; Margaret, 16; Solomon, 15; William, 13; Newbern, 8; Daniel, 6; Emely, 5; John, 4; Elizabeth, 1. Nothing is found in later records.)

Living next door is George C. BARRETT, 39, and Martha, 38, who may be John's parents or relatives. Or perhaps this is the correct story on these families: John and Minerva married in 1855 and 5 years later, they have 2 SCOTT children, ages 11 and 13, and 2 BARRETT children, ages 11 and 13. Nearby is son John, 25; Sarah, 20; Green, 3; Estile, 1; William HALK, 16. From BERRY researcher, Sue PLATER: William married Micah POWELL, 1819, NC. Son John D. married Sary TUCKER, 26 May 1846, Grundy County. On Dec 1860, John D. is deeding to S. H. TUCKER, two colts, yoke of oxen, 15 hogs, 15 barrels of corn, and one carriage, to "secure Berry's debt". Also in Grundy County Deed Book "B", Apr 1861, John D. is deeding to James LUSK, "gray mare named Bess about 8 years old, valued at \$100 for \$5, to secure Berry's debt to Jesse WOOTEN". State of Tennessee on the Indian camp North side of the Tennessee River

Personnally appearing before me George Foster, an acting Justice of the Peace in and from the county of Franklin & State aforsaid Ansell Mills of Lincoln County & made oath that he hath lost two horses described and at the same time came David Meeks of Franklin County and made oath gave testament that to the best of his recollection about two years ago he saw the two after described horses in the possesion of Samuel Ryley viz. One chestnut bay fallowed horse 5 years old about 11 hands & 1 inch high, no brand, white feet, blaze in his jaw, his left eye white, also one chestnut horse 6 years old 11& ½ inch hands high, a large blaze on his face, white feet and a white spot below his left knee, no brand. The said Meeks futher states on his oath that the said Ryley stated that he would carry them over to Col. Meigs & he believes he did take them to him.

David Meek (half-breed Cherokee)

This was taken in what would later become Pelham, Grundy County. David Meeks is the Father of all the Meeks who reside in or are from Grundy County. He had several sons and they to had several sons and daughters creating this mass "pocket" of Meeks People of Grundy County. Many of them intermarried with other mixed bloods and some full-blooded Indians carrying own the mission of the Chikamaka that the land would be held on to at all cost, even if it meant being "white".

I am descended from David's child Britain and down the line were brothers John "Crip-John" & Jerome Wiley Meeks, George Mack "Tsuli" Meeks, Marvin Meeks, James H. "Pony" Meeks. From Jerome comes direct from his first wife Mary Baker as full blood Chikamaka, their daughter Birdie Meeks. Birdie married Ellick "Turkey-Buzzard" Sanders. Their daughter Agnes Jane Sanders married Marvin Meeks. They had Vester, Phillip "Pidge", James H. "Pony". And Dorothy. My dad, James married Evelyn Lawson, or "Oo-low-shay" as it is in the Cherokee Language. My name is Tim Meeks, "Gvnidigardi" meaning "Buckshot". I married Catherine Flury, the only daughter of Thomas Flury and Marsha Tate Flury Cowan. We don't have children, bit I have a 14-year-old son Phillip Quinten "Pony" Meeks. Currently I am Prinicipal Chief of the Chikamaka Cherokee here in Grundy County. We are currently seeking to enroll all Meeks'as enrolled members descendant by blood.

John Francis Letter 1854

Bellevue, Iowa Nov 14th, 1854

G.C.H.S.

Dear Parents,

I arrived safely at Bellevue yesterday noon. I had to walk or rather run all the way from Galena to Bellevue for the man that I came with had such a load, that he could only carry my trunk, for which he charged me 3 shillings or bits, as they call them here. I left my trunk at the Hotel and found my way to the house where Mr Harrison boards. I found him at home, and told him who I was, when he said a man had been to him not an hour before to know if I had come, as there are three vacancies in some schools, in a new settlement about 6 miles from here and they can get no teachers to fill them, and Mr Harrison had told him I was coming, and he was waiting for me. I have not been to see about the school yet, as Mr. Harrison thinks I had better rest a spell, If I get the school I shall get \$20.00 per month and Board, and I think there is no danger but what I can get it. We crossed the Mississipi on a ferry boat, propelled by horses, on the endless chain principle. The river is from 1/4 to 1 mile wide here. Bellevue is a level piece of land between the surrounding bluffs. It is about as big as Mayville, (NY). The courthouse is in this town. Mr Harrison says he would advise no one to settle down round Bellevue as he has been here 18 years, and it is but little larger now than it was when he came here. He himself is going to move into Minnesota in the spring. He is going into Blue Earth county. He is acquainted with some surveyors who are now surveying it out, and they have told him where the best land is. They say it is the finest part of the United States. There is plenty of woodland and prairie and numerous little streams full of speckled trout. He says where you find speckled trout, you'll never get the fever and ague. He has offered me a chance to go with him. He says he will give me good wages, and I shall have a fine chance for getting just such a farm as I want, Everything is remarkably cheap round here. Wood alone almost is dear. Wheat is 80 cents a bushel. In general about 45 to 50 cents. Corn is 25 to 30 cents. Oats 20 cts. Hay is 4.00 a ton. If you come out here west, ever, never bring any cents, shillings or sixpence with you. A dime will go for as much as a shilling a 5 cent piece as much as a sixpence. Shillings are called long bits, 10 cents, is a short bit. And I was told at Galena that if I had a whole hatful of cents, I could not get a breakfast with them. Makoquita, (Maquoketa, Iowa) is about 25 miles from here, If I get a chance I shall try and go over and see Mr. Eddy. The prairies are burning round here considerable.

John Francis Letter 1854

Submitted by Bob Douglas

John Francis Letter 1854 continued:

G.C.H.S.

Tell Anne there are hundreds and thousands of acres of hazel nuts round here. I got a few, a few rods out of the town this afternoon, but the hogs, of which there are plenty round here, and which all run the streets, have eaten almost all off. You can only find them where the bushes were too high for them to get them.

There is a Congregational Church here. The Methodist have no church yet. They hold their meetings in the courthouse. The congregational, and a large house here, are built on the gravel wall plan. They look very neat though nothing has been done to the outside of them yet. They are now just like a solid mass of lime stone. All the stone on the bluffs round here is limestone, and there is plenty of it. The soil is rich, and deep but not so good as back on the prairies a little way.

They raise almost every thing in the shape of vegetables here. Mr. Harrison said he had as much as 10 bushels of mammoth tomatoes, as big as a baby's head, all rot on the ground. I told him I guess you would like to have been here to help him eat them. They also raise plenty of sweet potatoes here. All vegetables grow to an enormous size. Apples are worth 2.00 a bushel, and the are all brought up the river. The folks here take no pains in raising fruit, though it will all kinds grow nicely. We came across deer tracks coming from Galena in the snow which was about an inch or two deep. The rabbits here are so thick that you can kill quantities of them very easily. You have to go about 2 miles back on to the prairies, to get prairie chickens. You can get plenty of wild ducks and geese, quails and partridges. There is also plenty of fish in the Mississipi. The timber all over the country here is oak. The underbrush seems to be all hazel. I feel quite comfortable and at home here. Tell Grandpa I think it is a good job he wouldn't make a bet with you. All I want now is to get a nice place in Minnesota, and to have you come out here. I don't think I shall ever want particularly to come back to Westfield, (NY) when I can get along much better here. I don't know as I can think of much more to say. If I can get a paper here I will send you one. Give my love to all and I will conclude by remaining,



BROWN and CROSSLAND FAMILIES by Dan Willis Brown

Comments and corrections from our member Dan Willis Brown re Vol. IX, No. 1, pages 14 and 17.

The Jane Hudson on page 14 in the Howell Barker family is my Great Grandmother. She married John Daniel Brown, son of Ledden Brown and Louisa Arena Crossland. Louisa is buried in an unmarked grave in Schild Cemetery near Beersheba Springs. It is correct that Ledden is buried in Fuston Cemetery. John Daniel is buried in a small cemetery in East Texas and his wife Emma Jane Hudson is buried in Coleman, Texas City Cemetery. The wife of Howell Barker as far as I can find out, was Emma Jane's Aunt.

On page 17, several comments re Ledden Brown and family are incorrect.

Louisa Arena Crossland was one of the daughters of John Jefferson Crossland and Elizabeth Adams. Louisa was not born in Ireland. I have the birth and death dates of her parents and where they are buried.

JOHN DANIEL BROWN was born October 2, 1852 in Grundy County, Tennessee. He married EMMA JANE HUDSON on February 20, 1871 in Grundy County, Tennessee. She was born April 15, 1856 in Tennessee and died July 22, 1917 in the State Hospital in San Antonio, Texas and is buried in the City Cemetery in Coleman, Texas. He died November 19, 1892 and is buried in the cemetery in Pendleton, Texas near Waco and Temple. In the marriage records of Grundy County, Tennessee 1844-1880 it notes: BROWN, JOHN D. & E. J. HUDSON, license dated 20 February 1871 – no return – JOHN PATRICK, BONDSMAN – 141B. They were married in Grundy County as per the license.

NOTE: This information is from the J.J. Watts collection (1874-1912) manuscript notebooks of genealogical records kept by an itinerant minister in the northern Ozarks. It covers Phelps, Pulaski, Maries and parts of Dent and Texas Counties in Missouri. Loaned for copying by MRS LOUISE TANKERSLEY 1980.

JOHN JEFFERSON CROSSLAND was born in the Northern part of Middle Tennessee August 22, 1805 and died near Tribune, Missouri on June 20, 1896, aged 90 years. It is assumed that he is buried in Pulaski County, Missouri as that is where his wife is buried.

His wife, ELIZABETH ADAMS was born in Tennessee July 8, 1810, married in Tennessee to JOHN JEFFERSON CROSSLAND and died in the Smith Valley near Tribune, Missouri on November 23, 1893, aged 83 years, 4 months and 15 days. She is buried in the Friendship Cemetery of Pulaski County, Missouri and in plot 292. Note: The gravestone apparently reads November 28, 1892 as date of death. Tombstone apparently also reads her name as ELIZABETH E. and not S. The children of JOHN JEFFERSON CROSSLAND and ELIZABETH S. ADAMS were all born in Tennessee, the last three being born in Warren County, Tennessee.

She was married to a LEDDEN BROWN. One story that has been told about her was that she had flaming red hair. The children of LEDDEN BROWN and LOUISA ARENA CROSSLAND are covered later in this report.

CHARLOTTE TERNA was born May 2, 1831 and first married a JAMES ADAMS. The second marriage was to a REVERAND JAMES YATES. She died at the ABE JONES, near the old CHRISTON home on January 2, 1910. Aged 78 years and 8 months.

JOHN G. was born October 25, 1833. He married a STRICKLAND, a Baptist Minister, and was killed in the Civil War, date unknown.

ELIJAH MESHACK was born January 30, 1838 and married ?TIS CRUMFLEY and was killed in the Civil War near WALTER CHRISTON's on September 18, 1862, aged 24 years, 7 months, and 18 days.

ELIZABETH was born February 9, 1842 and first married ISAIAH S. BROWN and secondly to ABE JONES. She died at Tribune, Missouri on January 10, 1900. ISAIAH was a Brother to LEDDEN BROWN.

NOTE BY COMPILER: ISAIAH BROWN and his wife ELIZABETH CROSSLAND are both buried in the Clark Cemetery, Pulaski County, Missouri, in plot 15 and 16.

MARY ANN was born November 24, 1844, married a SMITH STORY and lived near W.S. BRADFORDS.

SAMUEL TURNER was born March 1, 1847 in Warren County, Tennessee and died August 20, 1924 in Missouri and is buried in the Friendship Cemetery in Pulaski County, Missouri and in plot 308. He was married October 10, 1866 in Pulaski County, Missouri to a LUCINDA M. ANDERSON. She was born March 27, 1847 in Tennessee and died March 23, 1929 in Pulaski County, Missouri.

NOTE: In one set of records from the J. J. WATTS collection (1874-1912) his middle name is spelled as TERNA, however from family records in the possession of a Great Grandson, JACK CROSSLAND, of 705 Osage, Humboldt, Kansas 66748, it is spelled as TURNER.

LAFAYETTE was born September 30, 1849 was killed by a horse kicking him on April 27, 1901, aged 51 years, 6 months, and 27 days.

WILLIAM was born November 22, 1852.

They are in Warren County, 1880: John, 36; Evaline, 26; Gillam, 9; Wesley, 7; Harrison, 5. In 1880 Warren County, living next door to son John and his family, is Mary, the mother, 63, and son Harris, 25.)

Hiram, 35, farm laborer; Susanah, 38; John R., 12; Eve M., 6; Sarah J., 3. (In 1850, Cannon County, Hiraim HILL, 24, born NC; Susanah, 25; John R., 5.)

HILL, District 10, Beersheba Springs

John, 30, carpenter; Mary C., 23, born GA; Amanda, 3, born AL; Charles A., 8 months, born TN. (This family seems to have moved to Tennessee about 1859. The only possible reference found is in Deed Book "C", 25 May 1860, to John W. HILL being witness to sale of land to Robert SANDERS, 30 acres for \$40, on road from Altamont to Northcut's Cove.)

HOODINPILE, District 5, Altamont

David, 59, farmer, born NC; Frances SANDERS, 62, born GA; David HOODINPILE, 3, born TN. (Marion, Sequatchie and Warren Counties had families with various spellings of the name HOODINPILE, but none with the name David.)

HOPKINS, District 5, Altamont

Henry C., 29, born NC; Christeana, 25, born NC; Martha E., 6, born AL; Mary E., 4, born AL; Celia M., 2, born TN; Jas. W. H., 4 months, born TN. (Information on birth states tells us this family came to Tennessee about 1856. In Grundy County Deed Book "B", 6 Dec 1861, Henry P. HOSKINS was witness to land sale of David CAMPBELL heirs, and 18 Apr 1862 mentions "place where Henry HOPKINS now lives". 1870, Grundy County, Christianna, 32, widow, born NC; Martha, 16, born Ala, seamstress; Mary, 14, born Ala, seamstress; Wm. H., 9; Louisa, 7; Anna J., 9 months. In 1880, Marion County, Christianna, 44, widow; William, son, 20.)

HUGHS, District 2, Altamont

Wade H., 56, farmer, born NC; Elizabeth, 43; Lorena, 8; Victoria, 8; Helen, 6; Sophronia, 4; Bruce, 3. (In 1850, Warren County, Wade H., 47, born NC; Thos. J., 16; Adaline, 12; Elvira, 8; Martha A., 23; Manerva E., 20. On 20 Sep 1852, Wade married Elizabeth FITZPATRICK, in Grundy County. In Deed Book "A", 21 May 1856, Wade H. HUGHS bought 400 acres for \$400 in District 9, and sold 50 acres to Alfred FULTS for \$50.

Did daughter Helen marry C. C. SMART, 14 Mar 1878, in Grundy County? Perhaps daughter Adaline married Wm. A. McCARLIN, 15 Dec 1859, in Cannon County. In 1860 they are still there: Wm. McCASLIN, 22; Adline, 19; living with Hanah McCASLIN, 54.)

HUMBLE, District 2, Post Office, Viola

Wiatt M., 36, farmer; File Ann, 30; John LOWE, 21, farm laborer; Jo. INGRAM, 18, male, servant. (In 1850, Bledsoe County, Wyaatt, 26; Philas A., 20. In Grundy County Earliest Deeds, by Charles Sherrill, page v, shows a law was enacted in 1858 that changed the lines between Grundy and Warren Counties "to include the whole of the farm and residence of Wyatt M. HUMBLE in Warren County". In Grundy County Deed Book "A", Mar 1853, Wiatt HUMBLE bought 3 tracts of land, for \$1200, from John MYERS, and in Deed Book "B", Feb 1863, W. M. HUMBLE sold 700 acres to James E. HOUGH, for \$10,000, land in Grundy and Warren Counties. In Warren County Will Book 3, page 62, "Fila Ann BONNOR, now Fila Ann HUMBLE" is mentioned in estate settlement of Wm. BONNOR, Sr.

(In 1860, Civil District 2, Altamont, but enumerated as though living next door to Wiatt is W. T. HUMBLE, 27; Lavena J., 29; Wiatt M., 3. Living not far from Wiatt, in 1850, Bledsoe County, is the family of Isaac and Margaret HUMBLE which includes a son, Washington L., 18, who might possibly be W. T. in 1860.)

IRVINE, District 6, Altamont

Wm. 53; stone mason, born Main; Jane, 27; Fanes J., female, 10; James, 8; William, 6; Elen, 5; Joseph, 4; Sarah, 3. (This family cannot be found in Tennessee, 1850, although mother Jane and all the children say born TN. In 1870, in Tracy City area: Wm. IRVIN, 53, farmer, born Ireland; Jane, 48; Mary, 18; Sarah, 16; Kate, 13; Britton, 10; James, 7 months. In the same area, in the Goins & Hobbs book but not in Sistler's, is Wm. IRVIN, 62, stone mason, born Ireland, living with John and Martha DAVIS. Daughter Mary seems to have married 1st a GOINS and then John B. THOMAS, 30 Dec 1888. In 1910, John B. THOMAS, 73, married 2nd; Mary C., 58, married 2nd; Annie L., 19; George W., 15. In Tracy City Cemetery, Wm. C. IRVIN, 1818-1888; Robert IRVIN, 1823-1894, who may be son Robert, born about 1873. In Pelham Church of Christ Cemetery: Mary C. THOMAS, 1 Sep 1851/31 Dec 1929; John B. THOMAS, 18 Mar 1837/21 Jan 1926.)

William, 72, born SC; Edith, 60, born SC. (Research here is to see if William and Edith are ancestors of the JACOBS families in Grundy County in early 1900s. In Rutherford County, 1850: William JACOBS, 67, born SC; Eda, 58, born SC; Alfred, 27; Berry, 22; Jeremiah, 20; William, 18; Synthia SIMPSON, 37; James M. SIMPSON, 13. Marriages of children:

By 1880, this family is in Coffee County: Burton, 60; Margaret, 50; Julian, 20; John, 18; Lafayet, 15. Son Jefferson married 2 Oct 1876, in Coffee County, Jocey GANN, and in 1880, they have daughter, Martha, 2. Daughter Mary married Benjamin VANDERFRIFF, 20 Sep 1876, and in 1880, Coffee County, there is neither Benjamin nor Mary VANDERGRIF. Daughter Julie married Thomas VANDAGRIFF, 28 Jun 1885, Coffee County.)

In 1870, Grundy County: Branch, 46; Sarah, 45; Thomas, 20; Samuel, 18; Letha J., 18; Martha, 14; Emery ADAMS, 3; Harrison ADAMS, 1; Peggie NORTHCUT, 50. Son Madison is believed to be the M. M. JOURDIN married Mary MARTIN, 3 Sep 1867, and in 1870, M. M., 23; Jane, 23; James, 1. In 1880, they are in Coffee County: M. M., 35; Mary, 35; James, 11; Sarah J., 8; Emma L., 2?; Richard, 3; Samuel, 11 months; Sarah, 57. Is daughter Elen the Mary E. JOURDON married S. H. STOTTS, 6 Apr 1867, Grundy County? In 1870, Richard STOTTS, 23; Ellen, 22; Robert, 2. Daughter Martha married David TALLMAN, 1 Oct 1877.)

SPRY, and in 1880, Marion County: Simon, 50; Sarah, 50; Isah, 12; James, 10; Amanda, 6. Daughter Mary A. may have married William HICKS, 24 Mar 1872, Franklin County.)

"DID YOU KNOW?"

On April 7, 1845 the Grundy County Court met and the following actions were taken: On petition of Ambrose Killian and others, it is ordered by the Court, that Jeremiah Walker, Noah Bort, (Bost?editors note), Abraham Jones, Johathon Tipton, Joseph Clay, Andrew Lockhart and John Gross, senr., be appointed a Jury of Vew, to mark and lay off a road, commencing at Noah Burts(Bort/Bost?editors note) passing Jeremiah, thence the nearest and best way to the county seat of Grundy county, and make report to the July term of this court.

This John Meeks and others the Jury of Vew, to lay off a road from the top of the mountain at the head of pains, (Paines/Paynes editors note), Cove to the county seat, made their report, and it is ordered by the court that said road as vewed by said Jury and marked be established as a road of the second class, and that James Meeks the present overseer open and keep the same in repair, with the bounds and hands heretofore allotted to him.

Talk given by Charles H. Sain at Wesley Chapel, Tennessee - 7/11/81

Presence here today recognizes the greatest burden any man can bear is a debt of gratitude, knowing in my life time debt of gratitude cannot be fully repaid. Appearance today is just a token repayment. Wesley Chapel, here is where it all began, everything I am, or hope to be, is based upon life as learned from you.

- 1. Wesley's Chapel taught me that there was a loving God.
- 2. Taught me to first be honest with myself because to be honest with fellow man you must understand honesty with yourself.
- 3. Wesley Chapel taught me how to work, not necessarily that hard, work always paid off. Success is not achieved instantaneously but does evolve by methodically, so called, climbing the ladder rung by rung and never giving up.
- 4. Wesley Chapel taught me to give your fellowman credit for what he is and not what you want him to be a sign, facing me on my desk for years said "O God with your help I will understand this person talking to me for what he is, and not what I want him to be."

During my period of time on this earth I have seen end of horse and buggy era, from unpaved, practically impassable, roads to interstate highways. Previous early years saw transportation of goods such as; wheat, hay, and other farm products transported on wagons pulled by mules. All farming was done with mules. Farm implements included such tools as; bull-tongue plow, turning plow, drag, spring tooth harrow, disc, double-shovel plow, culivator, and gee whiz. Threshing of wheat was done with threshing machines, wheat was cut with a binder. During threshing times neighbors helped each other by swapping out work. Wheat was sacked, then hauled by wagons, primarily, to Morrison Milling Company in Morrison, Tennessee.

Grocery stores did not exist, instead General Merchandise stores or peddlers was where everyone obtained such as sugar, coffee, and beans. Our diet consisted of bacon, (fat-back), back bones, and ribs from the hog. Beef was not a part of our diet because of no refrigeration. During spring and summer our diet consisted of vegetables, with fried chicken on Sundays. Everything, for winter, was canned and stored in cellars. Primarily, during winter we had choice of pinto or navy beans, or a combination of both.

Homes were heated with wood, primarily used in a fire place. Food was cooked on a wood stove. Clothing consisted primarily of overalls(demins) using buttons, as zippers had not been invented. All of the children went barefooted from early spring until late fall depending upon weather. Only two times of the day was recognized – sun-up and sun-down – no one kept up with hours. Personal cleaniness consisted of taking a bath at least once a week in a No. 2 wash tub – water was heated in a teakettle. Towels were made from flour sacks; wash clothes were unknown. Hands were cleaned by splashing water on face, then rubbing hands together to wash them. Soap was made in each home and consisted of lye as main ingredient that not only cleaned, but took everything off not substantially a part of your body. According to our present way of life, looking back during childhood, electricity, telephone, and other things enjoyed today had no part in our life.

Now let us get into the history of our region, starting with Warren County, which was formed in 1807 from part of White County, (Sparta), and is said to have been named for General William Warren who was killed at the battle of Bunker Hill. It is recognized that Elisha Pepper, who came from Virginia about 1800, was the first settler. Among early settlers were: Joseph Colville, John Lusk, Lyon Mitchell, William Lusk, Dr. John Wilson, Edward Hogue, Dr. W.P. Lawrence, Absalom Clark, Elijah Fletcher, John England, Irwin Hill, Oliver Charles, Abner Womack, William Womack, Chestley Webb, John Kirbey, Robert Biles, Archibald Prater, Allen Youngblood, Brown Spurlock, Thomas Gribble, Mason French, James Northcutt, Daniel Sain, William Smartt, Dr. Archibald Falkner, Asa Falkner, John Gross, James Cape, William Cummings, Joshua Hickerson, Oliver Charles, H.J.A. Hill, W.J. Stubblefield, John Davis, and James Elkins. Until 1810 the courts were held at the home of Joseph Westmoreland and in a log house near it about a half mile south of Barren Fork. This was near the celebrated, Poplar Tavern where people intended to settle on Elk River usually stopped. In March, 1809, McMinnville was selected as the county seat.

In August, 1810, McMinnville was laid off and lots were sold. In 1920, Warren County had a population of 17,309. Staple products were corn, wheat, oaks, and livestock. McMinnville, the count seat, had a population of 2,814 and was a flourishing town with fine schools and churches, a weekly newspaper, three banks, manufacturing establishments, plus prosperous stores, flour mills, and saw mills, etc. Morrison and Rock Island were other towns.

Coffee County was organized on May 2, 1836, and was originally a part of Warren, Franklin, and Bedford Counties. Coffee County was named in honor of General John Coffee. The following commissioners were pointed to run the boundary lines of the new county and locate county seat: Hugh Davidson, Alexander Blakely, David Hickerson, Thomas Powers,

William Bradshaw, and Lecil Bobo. Selected was a site on the lands of James Evans and Andrew Haynes, who, on March 1, 1836 donated 200 acres to the county for this purpose. In March of 1836 the following were elected magistrates form ten Civil Districts into which the county was divided: Adam Raburn, John G. Walker, Alfred Ashley, John Lusk, Larkin Burham, Robert S. Rayburn, Alexander Downey, James Yell, Gabriel Jones, William Hodge, Joseph Garrett, Joshua Berry, John Charles, William Montgomery, Wade Stroud, Lecil Bobo, John W. Camden, Jesse Wooten, James M. Arnold, and William Holmes. First session of the county court was on May 7, 1836 at the Baptist Meeting house on the site of Manchester. Sessions of the county court were held in the log house on this site and used by the Baptist as a church until 1837, when a court house was erected.

Manchester, the county seat, was named for Manchester, England because it was thought that the Coffee County capital would, in time. Be famed like its prototype for iron manufacturing.

Near Manchester, in the forks of Duck River, is Stone Fort, evidently a fortification of some prehistoric race. It encloses an area, 37 acres, and from its walls of loose stones, covered with dirt have grown trees of great age. In 1920 the population of Coffee County was 17,344.

Grundy County was formed on January 29, 1844 from parts of Coffee and Warren Counties and named for Felix Grundy who had been dealing extensively in the mountain lands of this section.

First county court was organized on August 6, 1844 with the following magistrates in attendance: Adrian Northcutt, John Fults, William Ambrose Killian, Robert Tate, Isaac Campbell, Steven M. Griswold, James Lockhart, John Burrows, Thomas Warren, and Daniel Sain. All sessions of the county court were held continuously at the home of Jesse Wooten until October, 1848 when county seat was established at Altamont. During early times of Grundy County a Swiss colony located near Altamont and became part of the mature progress of this county. In 19230 Grundy County has a population 9,753.

If asked to detail the earliest settlement of this area it would be said long before Warren County was named or populated, area had been claimed variously by Spain, France, and England; while at the same time being recognized as the property of the American Indian. At the time it was under the rule of England it became a part of the colony of North Carolina. After the Revolutionary War area was given by the /Sate of North Carolina to the Federal Government.

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Wesley Chapel by Charles H. Sain July 11, 1981

Ignored by the government of the United Sates, Tennessee County was for a brief period, State of Franklin, and then a portion of the territory south of the Ohio River. As a part of the State of North Carolina, Tennessee became Washington County, North Carolina

In 1783, Davidson County was formed from a portion of Washington County which contained the area of modern Warren County. Area became a portion of Sumner County when Davidson was divided in 1786. Ten years later, in 1796, it became a part of the new State of Tennessee and was still attached to Sumner County.

When Smith County was formed, from Sumner, in 1799 the area became a part of the county and continued so until White County was formed, from a portion of Smith, on September 7, 1806. It remained a part of White County, with the county seat at Rock Island, until Warren County was formed by the Tennessee General Assembly November 26, 1807.

Many explores crossed the county in the early years, not knowing at just what time the first white man came into Warren County area or when the first permanent settlers arrived, but the first of which we have any record came in 1769. In 1769, a company of men from North Carolina and Virginia came into middle Tennessee for the purpose of hunting. Among other places, they came up the Caney Fork River to a point far above the mouth of the stream and somewhere near the foot of the mountain. The vegetation they discovered was an area covered with very high grass. A record exists showing that in 1780 a party of 20 men from new settlements on the Cumberland River went into Caney Fork area on a hunting expedition. They returned to a bluff using canoes loaded with 105 bears, 75 buffaloes, and more than 80 deer. Scouting parties from the Cumberland settlements found Indians attacking settlements, frequently, retreated toward the Caney Fork. During scouting expeditions parties fell upon Indian trails and met war parties in the woods, with a great variety of fortune, sometimes disastrous and sometimes successful. It is safe to say that some of those who came to the Caney Fork were pleased with the beauty of the country and fertility of the soil, and that they came back at a later date to settle on the land. There were no permanent settlers in the Wesley Chapel area in 1792 or 1793 when an Indian ?Battle was fought at Rock Island. The area on which you are living today was still recognized as the property of the Indian until the ratification of the Third Treaty of Tellico made on April 24, 1806.

There is also, substantial evidence that some families had settled in the county of Warren as early as 1800, but no evidence, would show positive proof of a permanent settler before the Third Treaty of Tellico.

A petition of August 6, 1806 from the inhabitants of Smith County, Southwest of the Caney Fork, gives proof that more than 300 people were within the bounds of Warren County as formed by the General Assembly.

It has been confirmed that some of the early settlers on Hickory Creek were Moses, William and Joseph Guest who came in 1799; Dr. Archibald Falkner, 1802; Abner Gravess, 1803; William Pheres, 1804; Joseph Dow, 1805; and that also in 1805 came the brothers Stroud, William, Thomas, Anderson, Marshall, John., and Dickerson. It has been recognized and has become tradition family of Smartts were in the county before 1805. William C. Smartts returned to the county in 1805 accompanied by Joseph Coville who had recently married into the Smartt family. William Lusk settled at Shells Ford sometime after 1800 and there is some indication that Christian Shell had established a home on the old Indian trail before that time.

In the ten years from 1830 to 1840 Warren County was reduced in size because of the formation of the counties of Cannon, Coffee, DeKalb, and Van Buren

Note here that on Nov. 23, 1825 a post office was established known as Hickory Creek in the old Jesse Coffee house near the present town of Viola. After 1846 records show this location was in Coffee County, while in Warren County the postmasters were Jesse Coffee, appointed November 23, 1825; Jonathan Wooten, December 12, 1835; and A.B. Davis, May 28, 1846.

First church of Wesley Chapel area we have any record of was established at the present site of Viola on March 21, 1807. Today you recognize this site as a picnic area. Church was constituted as the "Baptist Church of Christ on Hickory Creek" and was later known as the Blue Springs Baptist Church. This church, like many of the earlier ones in the county, was listed in the category of Primitive Baptist.

Here is appropriate to detail the principals upon which this church was founded:

- 1. We believe in one Holy being and true God the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, these three are one.
- 2. We believe in the fall of man and that he has become a Depraved Creature.
- 3. We believe in the Salvation of our Souls and bodys in all these parts through the merit of Jesus Christ our Lord.
- 4. We believe that the old and new Testament is the Revealed will of God and the only rule of faith and practice.
- 5. We believe in Baptism by immersion is a Gospel Ordinance and believers ought to comply these with and no Others.
- 6. We believe that the benefits of redemption as applied by the Holy Gost.
- 7. We believe that the Sabath is a holy day and ought to be observed and that no work ought to be done except the works of needecsity, peity and mercy.

Blue Springs Church, not only assumed the responsibility of spreading God's word but, was disciplinarian to solve any problem that became an issue among the membership. Some of the records of this church are detailed as follows:

On Second Saturday in January, 1820, Church took up in consideration the contract of David G. Howard in respect of his going off after he obtained a letter from this church. He took away his Father's property to keep it from paying off

his just debts, therefore, he is excluded from fellowship and the church will write a letter to send him stating his conduct.

Other records show on Second Sunday in May, 1821, the committee reported that Elisha Price got drunk and said he had too much sense for God Almighty and God did not know how to keep his books, and at the day of Judgement he would come hopping and skipping and fair as well as any of them and it would take God all this lifetime to find him out, and that fell with Thomas Williams and said he could whip him before Hell could scorch a feather, this evidence by Lucy and Ann McFarling, and Brother King, a servant of Brother George Stubblefield and he saw him in the same evening and he thought he was drunk and for these things we declare an unfellowship with him.

Excerpts of these minutes, detailed here, to illustrate the part church played in everyone's life during this period of time, there are many other excerpts that could be recited to substantiate.

Now let us see how Grundy County was formed and to recite the minutes of the first meeting of the County Court of Grundy County. This meeting was held Monday, the 5th of August, 1844, and the records are detailed; Be it remembered that at a County Court begun and held for the County of Grundy at Beersheba Springs, place designated by law for holding the first courts of said County of Grundy, on the first Monday being the 5th day of August A.D. 1844 and 69th year of the Independence of the United States. Present the Worshiper Adrein Northcutt and William Dugan, President of that part of Grundy County taken from the County of Warren, at the Worshiper John Burrows, Alfred Braley (Brawley) resident of that part of Grundy County taken from County of Coffee, in pursuance of an act of the general Assembly of the State of Tennessee past at Nashville on the 29th day of January 1844, at proceeded to organize the County Court. Where upon Adrein Northcutt, John Fults, William Dugan, Ambrose Killian, Robert Tate, Issac Campbell, Steven M. Griaswold, James Lockhart, John Burrows, Thomas Warren, and Daniel Saine, Esquires produced their commissions in open court, under the great seal of the State and took the several oaths perscribed by law, for Justices of the Peace and was there upon admitted to excerise the functions of their office.

A detailed study of the minutes of Grundy County will show that the residences went to the County Court for very small items in accordance with our thinking of today. Certain items involved getting relief from having to pay 25 cents for a pole tax. Other items involved getting 25 cents for bringing a wildcat hide into Court. You should appreciate your position in life as compared to our ancestors. For an example; on the 28th day of December 1833 Daniel Sain agreed to borrow \$41.00 and put up as collateral the following: one roan mare and colt, one share yolk of oxen, 2 cows, 2 kids(goats), furniture, 11 head of sheep, and one house clock, warranting title.

Wesley Chapel by Charles H. Sain July 11, 1981

This should illustrate how much life meant to these people. Values, during these times, when compared to ours, have no place in our lifetime.

It is believed that Wesley's Chapel became a part of the Hickory Creek Methodist Church circuit starting about 1835. Membership rolls show many members in the late 1800's. Prior to Wesley's Chapel we find many names that are familiar to this community today as members of the Blue Springs Baptist Church previously referred to. Predominately mentioned is William Stroud, Bartholomew Wood, George Stubblefield, Jane (James) Cope, Thomas Mitchell, John Brown, John B. Woods, William McGehee, John Harding, Moses Guest, William Thompson. George Sain, Leroy Hammons, Elisha Reynolds, Benjamin Walker, John Gilbert, James Sykes, James Wood, William Champain, and Benjamin Hollingsworth. Other names mentioned many times are Anderson, Arnold, Batson, Bickle, Biggs, Bird, Bishop, Brawley, Bonner, Brock, Brook, Brown, Caine, Campbell, Champain, Chastain, Clerk or (Clark), Clingan, Colson, Conner, Cope, Counters, Cox, Crouch, Cunningham, Dement, Dennes, Dial, Dickerson, Dodson. Duncan, Durley, Eaton, Edde, Edwards, Forester, Fox, Franklin, Fulgam, Garner, Glazebrook, Gribble, Gilbert, Guest, Gwyn, Hale, Hard, Hammons, Hardin, Harpy, Harply, Hawkins, Hays, Herendon, Horton, Hawk, Howard, Hendon, Hutcheson, Hollingsworth, Jackson, Jones, Kelly, Lane, Lee, Lewis, Loe, Loyd, Linn, Linnby, Lynn, Lung, Mackelone, Mangram, Marbury, Markey, Mathews, McFarling, McGehee, McSpading, McMahan, Medders, Miller, Mitchell, Morrison, Parks, Powell, Price, Perry, Ramsey, Reynolds, Robertson, Rogers, Sain, Sheppard, Slatton, Smith, Spears, Spradling, Starkey, Stroud, Stubblefield, Sweet, Tanks, Tanksley, Thompson, Tipton, Vaughn, Walker, Williams, Willis, Wilson, Woods, Wood, Woodley, Wooten, Wooton, and Woosley.

Early roads in this area are Hill's trace and the Stage road. Hill's trace extended from Martin's Ferry to Viola and was layed out by Henry J.A. Hill in 1801 or 1802. We must assume that his road continued on to the Hickory Creek Valley settlement. The Stage road (Kentucky road) extended from Hillsboro to Viola and is mentioned in many deeds. The Kentucky road extended from the Alabama settlements through Hillsboro, Viola, went to the east at McMinnville, and on up through Rock Island to Monticello, Kentucky. These roads were a part of the Trail of Tears used by the Creek Indians in their travel from Creek Indian lands in Alabama to Oklahoma. Droves of slaves were driven up these roads prior to the Civil War.

Wesley Chapel by Charles H. Sain July 11, 1981

At the north end of bridge over Hickory Creek on the viola to McMinnville Road, prior to bridge being relocated in present location, was Hammond Tavern at Scott's Ford and was the first tavern in Warren County. Although no record is available to define when it was first established, it is known to have been an important stage stop on the old Kentucky road. This tavern was erected by Leroy Hammond and was later owned by the Scott family.

The first postoffice in this vicinity was established in 1825 at Jesse Coffee house which stood about one mile from Viola and was known as Hickory Creek Postoffice. In about 1833 somewhere in the vicinity of Viola was another postoffice called Glazebrooks with John R. Glazebrooks being postmaster. No definite date has been determined to define when Viola was founded but there is evidence that David Ramsey was operating a store near Viola in 1850. One report refers to R.L. Stubblefield operating a store there in 1853. It is known that Greek Brawley opened a second store in Viola after the Stubblefield store had closed in 1858. Viola postoffice was established on August 23, 1858 and named for a character in Shakespeare's play, (Twelfth Night). Before naming of the Viola postoffice the community had been called Blue Springs. Robert L. Stubblefield was the first postmaster and served until the coming of the Civil War. On September 22, 1886 this postoffice was discontinued and not re-established until May 20, 1870 with George T. Sain as postmaster.

In 1873 three businesses were operating in Viola, these were: J.E. Davis and Company, Davis & Smartt, and Patty & Sain. At viola's peak there were four general stores, a shoe store, a hardware, a drug and Millinery store, two saw mills, a lumber plant, two blacksmith shops, a barrel factory, saddle and harness shop, and a shop repair shop.

This area has contributed much to the military success of our country. In Warren County prior to 1833 there were 41 pensioned revolutionary soldiers living. Many other residents are known to have served in the Mexican War. Forty percent of the 16th Regiment were from the area and saw service in the Civil War. During the Civil War this area suffered much at the hands of both armies. McMinnville is known to have changed sides or hands seven times during the Civil War. All bridges and stations on the McMinnville & Manchester Railroad between McMinnville and Tullahoma were destroyed during the Civil War. Private property was occupied or confiscated by both armies. At the end of the Civil War little food or livestock was left in the vicinity. The personal fortune of the returning soldier was nonexistent, his money valueless and in many instances personal property had been confiscated or wrecked.

During a talk of this nature it is impossible to fully detail all history sufficiently to cover all aspects. It has been my sincere desire to cause you to be sufficiently interested to do research on your behalf.

Formation of Emmanuel Church of Christ Tracy City, Tennessee

As per notes found in Goforth handwriting:

In 1948, July 5, Elder Emmett J. Allen came to Tracy City, Tenn., and held a five-week revival meeting. Brother Allen's meeting was quite a success. There were over sixty baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus into the Emmanuel Church of Christ. After the tent meeting, he preached in the little church near Sander's crossing until April, 1949. While there he and the little church raised about \$800.00 to start a little church.

Mr. J.A. Goforth was appointed to find a location for the church. After searching the town over, he found a lot on the highway, near Frank Nunley's store. The lot is located in southwest Tracy City on Oak and Gum Street. Mr. Goforth got the deed for \$100.00.

Elder Emmett J. Allen, J.A. Goforth, and James Sitz were elected trustees of the Emmanuel Church of Christ. The building committee was elected. J.A. Goforth, Elder Emmett J. Allen and Mr. James Sitz were appointed to the building committee. J.A. Goforth was appointed chairman and Mr. L. Balthes (?) was building treasurer.

In March, they borrowed \$1000 from Mr. Paul Gibbs and gave a deed of trust on the church and lot. The money was placed in the Coalmont Bank. They were to pay Mr. Gibbs \$50.00 a month, plus interest, for ten years. They were to pay 6% interest at the end of the first year. If the directors failed to meet the payments, Mr. Gibbs could sell the house and lot for the remainder of the debt. If Mr. Gibbs needed his money, he was to allow the board six months to pay off the debt.

On April 19, 1949 J.A. Goforth resigned as director and John O'Neal was appointed in his place. Mr. Goforth loaned the church \$1,000 dollars. In June, they were able to move into the church.

The church staff was organized. Elder Emmett J. Allen was the pastor. Emmet Thomas was appointed Sup. of its Sunday school. J.A. Goforth was appointed treasurer and correspondent sect. J.A. Goforth was ordained as deacon of the church. Later James Sitz and George Coppinger were ordained deacons at Nashville.

On Aug. 17, 1951, the church paid J.A. Goforth \$900.00 that they owed him. On Jan. 1, 1953, Brother Allen gave up the Tracy City church and moved to Shelbyville.

Peter Turney - 1827 - 1903

C. S. A., Colonel, 1st. Tenn. Infantry 1861 - 65

Supreme Court, 1894 - 1892

Governor of Tennessee, 1892 - 1896

The Turney family has been prominent in the public life of Tennessee for several generations. The family descends from Henry Turney, a Frenchman who came to America prior to the Revolution. Tradition says Henry was married in France. He went to Holland for the benefit of his wife's health, where she died. He then married a Dutch woman and to this union was born a son, Peter Turney. This is all much earlier than the Peter Turney cited above as the title of this article.

Henry and his family came to America and settled in Washington Co., Va., in 1779. He and his son, Peter, were both mentioned in the court records of that county at the May term, 1779. Henry evidently settled in that part of Washington County, which was afterward found to be in North Carolina. Peter Turney's name is listed in Capt. Evan Shelby's company of Volunteers from Wautauga Valley who served in the Fincastle Battalion.

The Turneys moved to the Cumberland country as early as 1794 for in Sept. of that year, a Negro woman is mentioned as being stolen by the Indians from Peter Turney. Peter Turney settled in what is now Smith County. His land was located on the old Fort Blount Road, near present Dixon Springs.

Peter married Francis Haines and had four children:

Hopkins Lacey, b. 10/3/1797. M. Teresa Francis

Samuel, m. Fisk, lived in White Co.

James, went west

Charlotte. B. 1803, m. Wm. Sims, Warren County.

Peter Turney died in 1805 and is buried in the family cemetery on his farm inSmith County. After the death of Peter, the estate was dissipated by the administrators and his widow was left in poor circumstances. Of the above four children, we will here deal with #1. Hopkins Lacey Turney, who married Teresa Francis in 1826. She was born 12/09/1809 and died 9/05/1879. Hopkins Lacey Turney died in Winchester, Franklin Co., Tenn. on 8/01/1857. Shortly after his marriage, he removed from old Washington in Rhea County to the new town of Jasper in Marion County where he practiced law for about one year. He then moved to Winchester, Franklin County where he lived the rest of his life. The children of Hopkins Lacey Turney and Teresa Francis Turney were nine - #1 of whom was Peter, b. 9/28/1827 - m. 1st. Cassandra Garner, 2nd. Hannah Ferguson Graham.

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Peter Turney, son of Hopkins and Teresa, was born at Jasper, Tn. 10/19/1903. The foundation of his home place near Winchester on US 64 is still partially standing after the Yankees burned his home. He organized the 1 st. Tenn. Infantry, C. S. A., and was elected Colonel of that Regiment, which he served the four years of the War of 1861 - 1865.

He was elected to the Supreme Court in 1874 and served until 1892 when he was elected Governor of Tennessee in which office he served two terms 1892 to 1896.

Fourth child of Peter and Frances Haines Turney was Charlotte Turney, born in 1803 and married William Sims. of Warren County, who resided near Irving College. He was born in Virginia in 1797 and died in 1857. They had nine children. Their third child was James Turney, born 1825, and married Elizabeth (Bettie) Safley 1830 – 1912. To this union was born eight children. Among the eight was Lottie Sims, who married T.B. Roddy, of Tracy City; Allie, who married Mr. Petty also of Tracy City; and Ida, who married Ben Faulkner of McMinnville and lived there for many years.

Also among the eight children of Charlotte Turney and William Sims was William Polk Sims, b. 1847, who settled and farmed in Pelham, Tn.

As a child, I remember visiting "Uncle Polk's" farm and family in Pelham, and attending the funeral of a family member who was buried in a cemetery plot on the farm. Recently I wrote to retired Pelham postmaster Kenneth Wilson about the location of the farm. He wrote that the house and buildings were no longer there but hosts a nice brick home belonging to the family of the late Joe Howard Marlow of the Monteagle Winery. He stated the cemetery is still there, grown up, but has some nice large tomb stones. Wilson said he grew up on a farm near the Sims and recalled helping dig a grave or two in the Sims cemetery plot on their farm.

T. B. Roddy operated a large general merchandise store across from the Baggenstoss bakery in Tracy City for many years. The Roddy home place was a large two story residence built close to the store building on the corner of two streets. Ther was a covered passage - way built from the kitchen of the house into the store building. Mr. Roddy died of a heart attack in 1923. Lottie Sims Roddy died in 1958 and both are buried in the Tracy City Cemetery. They were my grandparents. As a child I remember visiting the big store.

They sold everything from cow feed and hardware items ands dynamite, to ladies slippers and dress material on the bolt.

I have fond memories of growing up in Tracy City, TN.

In 1870, the family is again in Marion County: John LATHRUM, 65, born VA; Jane, 59; Mary, 24; Henry, 20; Rebecca, 16; Arminda, 15; John, 10. Son William married Milly SCRUGGS, license dated 9 Nov 1865. By 1880, William, 42, works in hotel; Millie, 38; Cinda, 13; Nancy, 12; Mary, 4. W. is 67 and Bettie is 62, and Mary E., sister, 21, single, lives with them. I. W., born 10 Apr 1831, died 3 Mar 1903, buried Tarlton Cemetery. In 1910, Betty, 71, widow, no children/none living. She was born 28 Feb 1835, died 7 Jun 1910, and buried besides her husband. Same book, 30 Mar 1861, in sale of land for unpaid taxes William E. NORTHCUT is Tax Collector. Did widow Mary E. NORTHCUT marry Joseph SWEETEN, sometime in the 1860s? SHERRILL, page 282, Peyton L. POWELL, convicted of stabbing in Coffee County, was in state prison, 2 Jul 1856 to 17 May 1858, was born in Warren County, his father, Samuel POWELL, and his mother were living in Grundy County. Peyton was married but not living with his wife, had 2 children, Nancy Issabel, and William Samuel, bound to John WOOTEN, in Grundy County Deed Book "A", 5 May 1856, "to clothe and provide for them til age 21". There is a marriage for Peyton POWEL to Parlee WOOD, 18 Jul 1866, Cannon County.)



- 1. You will not marry during the term of your contract.
- 2. You are nor to keep company with men.
- 3. You must be home between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. unless attending a school function.
- 4. You may not loiter downtown in ice cream stores.
- 5. You may not travel beyond the city limits unless you have permission of the chairman of the board.
- 6. You may not ride in a carriage or automobile with any man unless he is your father or brother.
- 7. You may not smoke cigarettes.
- 8. You may not dress in bright colors.
- 9. You may in no circumstances dye your hair.
- 10. You must wear at least two petticoats.
- 11. Your dresses must not be any shorter than two inches above the ankle.
- 12. To keep the schoolroom neat and clean, you must: sweep the floor at least once daily; scrub the floor at least once a week with hot, soapy water; clean the blackboards at least once a day, and start the fire at 7 a.m. so the room will be warm by 8 a.m.

In 1870, Grundy County, Charles T., 43; Mary E., 39; Thomas, 16; Robert H., 13; James C., 9; Henry H., 7; Charles W., 5; Wesley B., 3; unnamed son, 1. In Coffee County, 29 May 1884, son Thomas M., minister, married Jennie T. CLENDENON, and in 1900, they have Buela B., 11; Ida M., 8. Son Charles W. married Lyda SUMMERS, 23 Mar 1895, and in 1900, they have Charles H., 3, and Elizabeth, 3 months; brother Robert H. WHITE, 43, single, school teacher, lives with them. Living nearby is brother James C., 39, wife Elizabeth, 41, and children: Bascom, Yancey, Victor, Charles and Roscoe. In District 8 is brother Hall H., 37; wife Laura, 38; Mary, 14; Henry, 5. The parents are in Warren (Red Hill) Cemetery: Charles T., 26 Jan 1826/27 Jan 1897; Mary C., 3 Oct 1830/29 Oct 1896.)

PATTON 200 acres in District 6, for \$1,000, now part of Eliza ROBERTS 200 acre tract on which she lives. In Deed Book "B", 2 June 1863, Deed to R. G. WHITE and others on above tract of land "because J. W. H. WHITE now deceased".)

WHITMAN, District 10, Altamont

Martha, 26; Isaac RANSOM, 5. (This is a short and confusing family history. In Warren County Will Book 1, 5 Aug 1841, Noah BOST is administrator of John BOST, deceased. In Will Books of the 1840s and 1850s, Noah is guardian of the heirs of John S. BOST. In 1850, Grundy County, Martha BOST, 16, lives in the family of Noah BOST. On 24 Jul 1850, Martha married Benjamin RANSOM and they probably are parents of Isaac RANSOM, born c1855. On 5 Apr 1856, Edward WHITMAN married Martha BOST, whose name probably was BOST-RANSOM. In Warren County, 1850, Edward, 16, was son of Uriah and Mary WHITMAN. There he had married Cela? BOST, 7 Sep 1854. In Grundy County Wills & Estates, 24 Nov 1856, Noah BOST is guardian of William WHITMAN, minor heir of Selah WHITMAN, deceased. In Warren County Will Book 3, 4 Nov 1857, Noah BOSS, guardian of heirs of John S. BOSS, deceased, produced receipt of Martha WHITMAN, formerly Martha BOSS, last of the minors. Nothing more found on these people.)

Uriah, 55, common laborer, born NC; Polly, 58; William R., 21; Abraham, 15; William FULTS, 30; Allie FULTS, 27; Mary FULTS, 5; Irving FULTS, 1; Susan FULTS, 2 months. (In 1850, Warren County, Uriah, 49; Mary, 50; John, 24; Alice, 17; Edward, 16; Jeremiah, 13; William R., 10; Abram, 6. Daughter Alice, or Allie, married William FULTS, 24 May 1855. In 1870, Uriah, 67, is head of household in DeKalb County. Son John married Matilda FULTS, 26 May 1852. Son Jeremiah married Elizabeth GREEN, 12 Jun 1856 and,

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WHITMAN continued: in 1860, Elizabeth, 21, is living with Samuel GREEN, 75, Alsia GREEN, 70, and Mary GREEN, 56. She has children: Savanah, 3, and Reuben, 1. The only WHITMAN in Grundy County, 1870, is John who married Matilda FULTS. See following family.)

John, 34, farm laborer; Matilda, 23; William, 2. (In 1850, Warren County, John, 24, is son of Uriah and Mary WHITMAN. John married Matilda FULTS, 26 May 1852, probably the daughter of Adam, Sr. and Jane Fults. By 1870, their family: John, 47; Tilda, 41; Sarah C., 8; Jessie, 3; Drucilla, The children, in 1880: Sarah, 18; Jessee, 13; Druciller, 10; Jane, 6; Elders, 4. Daughter Sarah married John S. GROSS, 13 Feb 1890 and died 1 Dec 1897, buried Philadelphia Church Cemetery. In 1900, John GROSS, 41, widower; Delia, 10; Ivey, 8; Hester, 5; Becher, 2. Son, Elder or Eldridge, married 1st Jessie HENLEY, 11 Sep 1898, and in 1900: Elder, 24; Jessie, 19; Matilda, mother, 69, widow, 16 children/15 living; Janie, sis, 24, servant; Mattie L., niece, 4. On 6 March 1905, Eldridge married Maggie WALKER, and in 1910: Eldridge, 33; Maggie, 30; Marshall, 4; Ornald, 3. On 13 Oct 1856, Thos. A. and wife, E. C. WILEY sold 36 acres to James HARRISON. In Dec 1859, a Tippling Bond was issued to T. A. WILEY. In 1870, there is a Thomas WILEY, 38, head of household in Lincoln County. Nothing more is found in Grundy County on Thomas A. and Elizabeth, but their sons are believed to have lived in Grundy County. James D. F. married Ellen FERRILL, 2 Jan 1879, and in 1900, James D., born Aug 1853, 46; Ellen, 41, no children. In same census, William H. WILEY, born Jan 1857, 42, and wife, Luvina, 44, have no children.)

In 1870, Grundy County, William, 46; Sousan, 39;

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WILLIS continued: Sarah, 15; Edmon, 12; William, 10; Joseph, 8; Betty, 6; Robert, 4; John, 9 months; Emmy McCONEL, 15, black, servant. Daughter Sarah or Sallie V. married Thomas N. FOX, 11 May 1879 and died 10 Feb 1882. She is buried in Willis Cemetery beside her husband, T. N. FOX, Apr 26 1850/Apr 14 1884. In Grundy County Estate Settlements, 3 Jan 1888, W. H. WILLIS, Sr. is made guardian of Mary Green FOX, minor child of T. N. FOX, deceased. Son Edmon married N. C. 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NEIGHBORS IN THE TENNESSEE PENITENTIARY, 1831 - 1850

Charles A. and Tomye M. Sherrill have published two books on "Tennessee Convicts" based on ledgers maintained by the Keeper of the Penitentiary and housed in the Tennessee State Library and Archives, in Nashville.

The first prisoner was received in the new penitentiary, in Nashville, on 21 Jan 1831. Here are excerpts from Volume I of "Tennessee Convicts", 1831 to 1850, of interest to neighbors in Grundy and surrounding counties.

ARMSTRONG, John, 35, blacksmith, born GA, convicted of horse stealing in Franklin County, in penitentiary from 19 July 1831 to 19 July 1837. Conduct: generally good.

BANKS, Jesse M., 30, born VA, convicted of petit larceny in Coffee County. In prison from 10 Nov 1845 to 10 Nov 1846.

BARBEE, Beasley, about 20, 5' 9" tall, 165 lbs., dark skin and hair, grey eyes, born Orange County, NC, brought up partly in Marion County, TN, found guilty of malicious shooting and sentenced to 4 years, 8 months. Entered prison 9 Apr 1831 and died of cholera June 1833.

BRADFUTE, Archibald, 16 yrs, 5' 7", 125 lbs, fair hair and skin, hazle eyes. Born and brought up in Nashville where his father, Rob, still lives and is a bricklayer. Sentenced to 3 years, from 2 June 1841, for horse stealing in Warren County.

BROUGHTON, Charles T., 27, 5' 7½" high, 170 lbs, blue eyes, fair skin, dark hair, round face, good countenance. His wife lives with her mother, Widow Perry, near Smith Mill, on Duck River, in Bedford County. In penitentiary from 23 Jan 1832 to 30 Mar 1834. Detained 66 days for bad conduct. Another note says: conduct exceptionable.

BRUMLEY, William. From Marion County, 25, 5'4", 143 lbs, fair skin and hair, blue eyes, born Knox County. Father is dead and mother, Mrs. Margaret Brumley, and sister, Mrs. James Craig, live on Tellico River, 7 miles from Jasper. Sentenced to 10 years for murder, beginning 24 July 1840.

CASH, Jefferson, 24, 5' 11", 155 lbs, light hair, fair skin, blue eyes. Born in Augusta County, VA, brought up in Coffee County, Tenn, where his father, William Cash, lives, about 4 miles from Pelham. Convicted of grand larceny in Davidson County. Sentenced to 11 years, from 26 Dec 1849. Pardoned under the act of 1836, 20 Apr 1860.

COLEMAN, John, 22, born Virginia, sentenced to 3 years for horse stealing in Warren County. Entered penitentiary 15 Mar 1832, pardoned by governor 16 Mar 1832.

COLLINS, Joseph, 28, 5' $8\frac{1}{4}$ ", 161 lbs, blue eyes, dark hair, sandy complexion, born SC but brought up in Blount County, Tenn. Has wife, daughter of

COLLINS, Joseph, continued: Richard Jones, living there. Convicted of horse stealing in Franklin County and sentenced to 6 years. Entered prison 23 Jan 1834 and died of fever (cholera), 15 Sep 1835.

COLLINS, Isaac, 17, 6' ½", 140 lbs., fair hair, hazle eyes and sallow complexion. Born and brought up in Coffee County. His father, W. Collins, lives 5 miles south of the old stone fort on the road from Winchester to Nashville. His wife lives with her father, Peyton Strong, in the same settlement. Sentenced to 3 years, from 13 Oct 1842, for horse stealing in Lincoln County.

COOK, Joseph C., 23, 5' 9", 140 lbs, fair hair, yellowish grey eyes, dark skin, hair and eyebrows. Born in Warren County, brought up in Franklin County, nine miles north of Winchester, on Elk River at Jones Fork, where his mother and step father, Allen Young, live. Mother has had 3 husbands and 9 children. Sentenced to 3 years for forgery, beginning 26 Nov 1840, discharged 28 Nov 1843. Conduct: fair.

DANIEL, Perry, 27, 5' $7\frac{1}{2}$ ", 172 lbs, born near the Pedee River, in Marrion County, South Carolina, brought up in Overton County, Tenn, where his mother, Dicy Daniel, lives, has 2 brothers and 1 sister in Sequatchee Valley. Convicted of petit larceny and in prison from 3 July 1838 to 4 July 1839.

DOUGAN, John, 45, 5' 10" high, 180 lbs, dark hair somewhat grey, dark complexion, grey eyes. Born NC, brought up in Kentucky. Father, mother, and wife live in Franklin County, Tenn. Given 10 years for manslaughter in Franklin County. Received at Penitentiary 27 Jan 1831, died of cholera 14 June 1833.

GILBERT, Joseph B., from Warren County, 17, 5'7", 150 lbs., dark hair and skin, black eyes, good countenance. A farmer, born Virginia, brought up in McMinn County, Tenn. Convicted of murder in Warren County. Received 31 Dec 1838 and pardoned by Gov. Polk, 29 Jan 1840.

HARE, Robert, 21, 5' 9" high, 201 lbs, dark hair, light blue eyes, fair complexion. Born Barren County, Kentucky, brought up in Giles County, Tenn., where his father now lives. Has 2 brothers, Charles and Alexander Coulter. Married Miss Smith, now living with her mother in Warren County, $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles from McMinnville. Given $3\frac{1}{2}$ years for horse stealing in Bedford County. Served from 7 Dec 1832 to 18 June 1836. Conduct good.

HENSHAW, John, 19, born Tenn., laborer, convicted of larceny in Warren County. Given 1 year sentence, received 19 Jan 1843, discharged 24 Feb 1845. Conduct good except attempt to escape.

HERNDON, George, 37, 5' 6" high, 122 lbs, grey hair, hollow grey eyes, short face, beard. Born in Virginia where parents and siblings still live. Has wife and 8 children in Lincoln County, Tenn. Given 3 years for altering a cotton receipt in Franklin County. In penitentiary 23 July 1832, discharged 22 July 1835. Conduct good.

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JACOBS, William P?, born Orange County, Virginia, 21, 5' 8" tall, 150 lbs, light hair, blue eyes, fair skin, has scar on his cruper bone on his rump, the size of a dollar. Father is Nathaniel Jacobs. Has one uncle, on his mothers side, in Ohio, named Reuben Strong; one sister, married to Ambrose Smith, living in Culpepper Co., Virginia. Sentenced to 3 years in Franklin County for forgery. Received 7 Dec 1837. Pardoned 2 Oct 1840.

JARNAGIN, Allen, 58, 5'7" tall, 126 pounds, dark gray hair, blue eyes, large Roman nose, born Johnson County, NC, has wife and 2 children in Coffee Co., Tenn. Has 6 children married and living in same county. Convicted of malicious stabbing in Davidson County, sentenced to 3 years, from 12 Dec 1837. Discharged 18 Oct 1840, pardoned by Gov. Polk. Conduct good.

JOLLY, Asbury, 24, 5'10" tall, 170 pounds, dark hair, grey eyes, dark skin, born Ky, brought up in Franklin County, Tenn and Jackson County, Alabama. Married Nervazene Bridges, daughter of Wm. Bridges, of Jackson County, Alabama. Has no children. Wife now with his father, Stephen Jolly, in Bedford County, Tenn. Found guilty of grand larceny in Bedford County. Served from 11 Jun 1835 to 15 Jul 1838. Detained 35 days for improper conduct. Another note says conduct good.

LEFEVER, William, 28 years, 5'10'2" high, 175 lbs., gray eyes, fair skin andhair, red beard. Born Sparklinburg, South Carolina, brought up in Burke County, North Carolina, where most of his relatives now live. Brother in Warren County, Tenn. and another in Missouri. Wife living with friends in Sequatchee Valley. Sentenced to 3 years for forgery in Franklin County. Discharged at expiration of sentence on 1 Nov 1834, Detained 106 days for bad conduct.

MAYFIELD, Avery, 24 years, 5'9", 173 lbs, hazle eyes, dark skin, large face, and fair complexion, born in Savier County, Tenn. Was apprentice in hatters business. Living Warren County. Married Elizabeth Dotson, daughter of James, then of Marion County, Tenn, who now lives in Cherokee Nation. Has wife and 4 children in Warren County. Sentenced for larceny in Warren County. Received at Penitentiary 10 Feb 1835, died of cholera, 30 June 1835.

McCALL, Robert, 6'2½", 191½ lbs, dark hair, blue eyes, tolerably fair skin, born North Carolina, brought up in Jefferson County, Tenn. Wife and 6 children on Wolf River, near Moscow, Fayette County, Tenn. Wife's parents in Warren County, Tenn. Sentenced to 2 years for voluntary manslaughter in Fayette Co., 8 Sep 1834 to 18 Oct 1836. Detained 40 days for bad conduct.

McCLUSKEY, William, 45, 5'10", black and heavy beard, dark grey eyes, black hair getting bald, heavy coat of hair on breast, born South Carolina, parents and wife and 9 children live 10 miles out of Fayetteville, Tenn. Two daughters Mrs. James McCoun and Mrs. James Jones, in same neighborhood. Convicted of manslaughter in Lincoln County. Served 1 Apr 1836 to 10 July 1838. Conduct good.

McGREW, John, 19, 6' tall, 178 lbs, fair hair and skin, hazle eyes, born Ga., brought up in Maury Co., Tenn. Guilty of horse stealing in Franklin County. Served from 24 Jan 1839 to 26 Jan 1842. Conduct exceptionable. Has no siblings, mother dead, father doesn't know where he (John) is.

McGUIRE, Jackson, 24, 5'4" tall, 120 lbs, dark hair, fair skin, hazle eyes. Born in White County, Tenn. Has lived in Bedford County. Wife is deceased. Has 1 child with grandmother, Nancy Beard, Bedford County. Served 1 year for petit larceny in Franklin County, 29 July 1840 to 29 July 1841.

McGUIRE, Wesley, 21, 5'8" tall, 148 lbs, light hair and skin, blue eyes, born White County, near Blue Springs Cove. Has wife and child on the waters of Flat Creek, near her father, Elijah Oozle. Guilty of petit larceny in Franklin County. Served from 29 July 1840 to 29 July 1841.

MILES, William, 32, 5'10" high, 162 lbs, born Jackson County, Tenn., brought up in Franklin County. Has wife and 6 children 10 miles east of Winchester. Wife was Miss Timms?. Guilty of grand larceny, Franklin County, sentenced to 3 years in penitentiary. Served 23 May 1839 to 14 Apr 1842. Pardoned by Gov. Jones.

PERDUE, John, 33, 5'7" tall, 150 lbs, fair hair and skin, blue eyes, born in Virginia, brought up in Wayne County, Kentucky. Has wife and 2 children in Franklin County with her father, near Mud Creek Meeting House. Father is Timothy Ruark. Perdue convicted of passing counterfeit money in Coffee County. In penitentiary from 22 Dec 1841 to 23 Dec 1844.

PETTY, John, about 21, 5'7" high, 152 lbs, a stout and good form, light hair, grey eyes, good countenance, deep in the head, under teeth juts in, small mouth. Born in Franklin County, Tenn and raised by Grandfather Petty, near McMinnville. His wife, formerly a Hedgecock, in same neighborhood. Mother married to Johnathan Armstrong, lives on the waters of Black Warrior. Served 4 years for grand larceny in Franklin County, 6 May 1836 to 8 May 1840.

POSEY, John, 56, 5'9", 179 lbs, grey hair, full face, black eyes, fair skin. Born and brought up in South Carolina. Married twice, 5 children. His mother, Sarrah Ann Posey, lives near Winchester, Tenn. Convicted of receiving stolen goods in Lawrence County. Four years in prison, 19 Mar 1838 to 30 Mar 1842.

PRUETT, Richard C., occupation: lawyer, 40, 5'10" tall, 173 lbs, fair skin and hair, blue eyes. Born in Albert County, Georgia, brought up in Lincoln County, Tenn. Has wife and 8 children living 13½ miles west of Winchester. Received 7 year sentence for horse stealing in Franklin County. Sentence began 29 Mar 1842. Discharged 10 June 1843, died of marasmus.

PUCKETT, Jesse L., 13 yrs old, 5'1" tall, 99 lbs, fair hair and skin, good countenance, blue eyes. Born and brought up in Trigg County, Kentucky, where his mother, Sarah Puckett lives. She has 12 children. Jesse convicted of grand larceny in Warren County. Served 18 May 1842 to 18 May 1845.

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PUGH, Samuel, 31, 5'10", 168 pounds, black eyes, dark hair, heavy beard, large nose, thin visage. Born Greene County, Tenn. Married Mildred Reid, daughter of James, of Pendleton District, South Carolina. Wife and 4 children reside on Sequatchie River, Sequache Valley, 5 miles from Jasper. Received 1 year sentence for petit larceny in Marion County, beginning 23 Apr 1835. He died of cholera, 30 June 1835.

ROBERTS, Smith, from White County, 19, 5'7" tall, 131 lbs, fair hair and skin, blue eyes, down look. Born and brought up in White County, 10 miles south of Sparta, where mother, 2 brothers and 2 sisters now live. Received 1 year sentence for petit larceny, 3 July 1837 to 29 June 1838. At age 23, Smith Roberts was convicted of grand larceny in Marion County and spent 3 years in State Penitentiary, 28 Mar 1839 to 21 Mar 1842. His conduct was exceptionable.

SARTAIN, James, 44, 6' high, 147 lbs, dark grey hair, black eyes, dark skin. Born in Georgia, brought up in Franklin County, Tenn. Has wife and 5 children in Coffee County, on Elk River, 4 miles above Caldwell's bridge. Her name was Simmons?. Sartain convicted of murder in Coffee County and sentenced to 6 years, 17 Dec 1841 to 23 Sep 1847.

SCOTT, James, 38, 5'9½" tall, 180 pounds, dark gray hair, hazle eyes, dark skin, shoemaker, born Lincoln County, North Carolina, brought up Overton County, Tenn. Married 1st, 2 children, one deceased, other married to George Hill and lives on Crow Creek, Franklin County. Second wife lives in the round cove, Franklin County, near her father, Wm. Wilkerson, 4 miles south west of Shumaker's Meeting House. One uncle, Perry Hill, Franklin County. Scott convicted of stealing a negro in Davidson County. Entered prison 15 Dec 1840, pardoned 30 Aug 1843.

SCOTT, Nancy Ann, 20, 5'5-3/4" tall, 130 pounds. Born and brought up in Bledsoe County, Tenn. Mother, Nancy Smith, lives in "Siquoidshee" (Sequatchie) Valley. Girl is bright mulatto, mother is white, father is coloured man. Convicted of larceny and in prison, 14 June 1840 to 12 May 1842.

SCOTT, Thomas, 45, born North Carolina, stone cutter, convicted of larceny in Franklin County and sentenced to 5 years, Jan 16, 1847 to 26 Sep 1851.

SMITH, Francis, 22, 5'9½" tall, 146 pounds, dark hair, black or dark yellow eyes, swarthy complexion, born and raised in Franklin County, where his father, 1 brother and 1 sister now live. Mother is dead. Has some half brothers and sisters on Alabama River, near Independence Town. Received 3 year sentence for grand larceny in Williamson County, 29 Feb 1832 to 28 Feb 1835.

SMITH, John, 22, born Georgia, labourer, sentenced in Coffee County for larceny, 13 Feb 1849 to 13 Feb 1850.

STEEL, George D., 26, laborer, born Kentucky, convicted in Marion County of maiming and sentenced to 2 years. 30 Mar 1843 to 25 Mar 1845.

SWAFFORD, William, 30, 5'11" high, 167 pounds, blue eyes, light hair, a little inclined to be sandy, not very fair skin, heavy and sandy beard,

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SWAFFORD, William continued: Born Pendleton County, North Carolina, raised Jackson and Bledsoe Counties, Tenn. Detained 30 days for bad conduct.

THACKER, Joel, 41, born South Carolina, waggon maker, convicted in Coffee County of assault with intent to kill, sentenced to 3 years. In prison, 9 Mar 1847 to 17 July 1848. Pardoned by Gov. Brown.

THAXTON, Martin, 22, 5'9½", 128 lbs, dark hair, eyes and skin. Born and brought up in Warren County, Tenn, 8 miles south of McMinnville, on the stage road to Huntsville, where his very old father and brother, John, now live. Has brother Thomas in Rhea County, Missouri, and sister, Mrs. Robert Ellison, in Gibson County, Tenn. Two sisters, Mrs. Elisha Runnels and Mrs. James Ellison, in Warren County. Sentenced to 3½ years for horse stealing in Rutherford County. Extra 6 months added to sentence because of attempted escape. Conduct bad. Served 22 Jul 1840 to 31 July 1844.

TIMMONS, William A., from Coffee County, 54, 5'9" tall, 161 pounds, grey hair, fair skin, black eyes. Occupation: soldier. Born and brought up in Delaware, relations live in Ohio and Indiana. Has wife and 6 children in Coffee County. Convicted of rape and sentenced to 10 years, 4 July 1842 to 10 Dec 1851.

TIMS, Reuben and Larkin, brothers, received at the penitentiary, 5 Oct 1835. Reuben about 25, 4'10" high, 116 pounds, dark hair, hazle eyes, thin visage, long nose and chin, thin beard mostly on upper lip, a little bow-legged. Larkin about 20 years old, 5'6" high, 135 lbs, black hair, hazle eyes, common complexion, and "a contenance not indicative of a confirmed rascal". The brothers were born in South Carolina and brought up in Franklin County, Tenn. Their father lived within 2 miles of Winchester and later lived 9 miles down Elk River to the "Rich Hill" area, and lived in Madison County where Reuben married Nancy Matthews, daughter of John. He left wife and child in McCracken County, Kentucky. Larkin has lived much the same life as Reuben and in the same areas. The brothers were sentenced to 5 years for horse stealing in Stewart County. Larkin was in penitentiary until pardoned by Gov. Polk, 9 Aug 1840. Reuben discharged 7 Oct 1840. Conduct bad.

TURLEY, Alfred, age 18, convicted in Franklin County of grand larceny and sentenced to 4 years. In prison, Mar 31, 1843 to Aug 17, 1844. Died of chronic diarrhea.

TURNER, Bailey, 55, born North Carolina, convicted of poligamy in Warren County. In prison 4 July 1849. Pardoned by Gov. Trousdale, 10 Feb 1850.

WILSON, Joshua J., 68, born Virginia, convicted in Marion County of murder. In prison, July 24, 1838 to June 1, 1849. Died of general dropsy.


