Cemetery Tour Well Attended

The program for the June 20, 2019 meeting of the Warren County Genealogical and Historical Association was a tour of part of the Mountain View Cemetery in McMinnville.

Our tour guide was Rickey Burks, who is a Mountain View historian, a local minister and is associated with the Prater Auction Company in McMinnville.

It was a warm afternoon and the constant breeze

was a welcome relief by the well-attended group.

Mr. Burks explained that the land where the cemetery is located was in the general vicinity of Cherokee Indian hunting grounds.

In 1817 a house was built on the land known as "Hickory Hill". It was the home of Leighton Ferrell, who was an early sheriff of Warren County.

By 1835-36 the house was bought by Samuel H. Laughlin. He was a lawyer, politician, newspaper editor and senator for Warren County. The house was torn down and another built for the caretaker. This is where Alan and Cleo Ware lived.

Mr. Laughlin, along with Joseph Towles were instrumental in blocking the proposed Faulkners Spring Pike road.

The cemetery's original name was Mountain View Cemetery established by the Mountain View Cemetery Company. It was later known as Mt View Cemetery and is now officially Mountain View Cemetery LLC. It was chartered in February 1924. Officers elected were T.R. Clark, M. J. Bass, F.C. Boyd, R. G. Hutchins, Joseph Gessler, B. E. McElroy, W.A. Passmore, G. M. Smith, and John Willis, who was added in March 1924.

T.R. Clark sold 132 acres of land to the cemetery board on February 18, 1924 for \$12,000. All but the existing 32 acres of land was later sold.

The first plots bought were in lots Sect. 2 #46-47, by F. L. Kirby and Thomas Chastain. The first burial was confederate veteran F. C. Lowery.

Mountain View is well known as the final resting place for country recording star Dottie West who was originally from the area. She was born Dorothy



Marie West and was buried on September 4, 1991. Her mother Pelina Marsh is buried beside her.

Civil War veterans buried here are Confederate soldiers Fesington C. Lowery, William T. Earles, Jasper Martin and Hamilton M. Hennessee.

Other people of interest discussed on this tour that are buried at Mountain View include:

Fernando C. and Sarah Jane Boyd – Founders of Boyd Nursery

T.Q. Martin – Former minister of Central Church of Christ

R. A. Reams – Former editor of the Southern Standard

Sheriff Haston – Former sheriff of Van Buren County who was murdered

The Elkins family – Elkins Hardware owners
The Molloy family – Molloy Dry Cleaners



Alan Ware was caretaker of Mt. View for several years. He and his wife Cleo Curtis Ware lived in the house located on the cemetery grounds. Their daughter Betty Ware grew up here.

E. L. Groves – Army Air Cadet killed in a training mission in Alabama

Amy Croft – Former servant of the Sedberry Hotel

C. M. Clark – Murdered Sheriff Haston

B. E. McElroy – One of the original stock holders of the cemetery, former post master of Van Buren Co. He was hit by a truck and killed in from of High's Funeral Home

Dr. Maloney – Well known McMinnville physician

Cowan Oldham – Original Park Theatre owner J. J. Walker – Former Mayor of McMinnville Charles Faulkner Bryan – American composer Leonard Smith – Owner of Powermatic

"Dixie" Roberts – Vanderbilt University football star

Franklin "Chick" Brown – was press secretary for Gen. Douglas McArthur and was former Director of WBMC.

This is the first of 3 planned tours of Mountain View Cemetery by the WCGHA. The size of the cemetery makes it difficult to tour the entire cemetery in the time frame allotted for our monthly meetings. Watch for additional dates to be announced.

Andy has been building dioramas for approximately nine years.


Featured on Tennessee Crossroads, his work has been on display at the Lane Motor Museum in Nashville, Tennessee.
