




STATE'S PREHISTORIC RELICS

A recent issue of the McMinnville Southern Standard contains an account of what are supposed to be Mound Builder relics on Cardwell Mountain, a few miles northeast of McMinnville. Several of these mounds, it is stated, still weather the elements on the mountain side. Another collection of mounds is to be found at Irving College.

Sometime ago Judge Frank R. Davis, the newspaper records, uncovered several skeletons of a primitive race buried near the Cardwell Mountain mounds. These skeletons gave evidence of a people not more than five and a half feet tall, but stockily built.


