Between 1870 and 1880, Mary An BRYANT married ______ TATE and had 3 children: Amanda J. (called Jennie), Patrick D. (called Doug), and Martha M. (called Malinda). On the death record of Martha Linda TATE DIXON, her father's name is given as M. D. TATE, called Ned. Oral history says they were part of the Martin Springs/Battle Creek Tate families.

Information (oral and factual) on the children of Mary Ann (BRYANT) TATE: (1) Jennie TATE married Crawford HARRIS, 12-26-1886, Marion County. In the 1900 census, she probably is the Jane A. TATE, cousin, 28, born Feb 1872, widow, (1 child/1 living), with Bessie TATE, 8, born Nov 1891. They are living with the large family of BRYANT brothers and sisters, headed by Samuel BRYANT. From the TATE genealogy in "Leaves From The Family Tree" by Penelope J. Allen, we learn that these Bryants are the children of Abigail TATE who married Houston BRYANT. In 1910, Jennie TATE, sister-in-law, 39, divorced, is living with Robert A. and Malinda (TATE) DIXON. (2) Patrick Doug is said to have died about age 14 and to be buried "at the Indian Cemetery near Foster Falls". (3) Malinda married Robert A. DIXON, c1895, and had: Dollie, Louie, Pat, Ada, Lou, Rosa, Robert and Sarah in the 1910 census. Robert and Malinda are buried Red Hill Cemetery, Marion County.
