Chapel in honor of the first pastor.

On October 14, 1899, the people of Lee's Chapel community met to organize a Missionary Baptist Church. The Pleasant Mountain Baptist Church was organized with Rev. W.T. Churchwell as pastor. The Presbytery consisted of Brethren Montgomery, Robertson, Churchwell, and McBrayer. Some of the members were P.M. Mullins, J.A. Millwood, Sarah Mullins, Minnie Mullins, and Levi McBrayer.

Land on the mountain sold for fifty cents per acre or a days work, and no longer than twenty-five years ago, it sold for four dollars per acre.

The first school was taught on Blount Highland in 1886 by A.F. Whitley. It grew from a one teacher school to five teacher school but is now reduced to a three teacher school with a modern new building. One man who contributed to the upbuilding of the school and community was J.B. Armstrong who was teacher for a number of years.

The community once boasted of two general merchandise stores, operated by R.B. Lacy and R.D. Butler.

In 1918 before automobiles became plentiful, a truck growing and a canning company was organized which operated successfully for two years. The company bought a large truck and hauled the vegetables to Birmingham to market. It also owned a canner with which it canned the surplus fruits and vegetables for market. The community is now a truck growing community; growing vegetables and berries for the Birmingham market. It grows strawberries, all kinds of vegetables, and the famed Lucretia dewberry. Thirteen boys from Blount Highland went to the World War and all thirteen returned and are still living.

In now has one coal mine; the coal being hauled in trucks. Several men have operated saw mills in the community, cutting the long leaf pine for which it has been dubbed Pine Mountain.

This community has been visited by two cyclones. The first one destroyed some homes and injured several people. The second one did not injure a person but completely demolished both church buildings, the school building, and teacherage, all of which have been rebuilt.

Blount Springs - written by Bessie Warren

Blount Springs community is located on the Bee Line Highway between Garden City and Warrior. In the year 1818, Jonas Byars moved from N. Carolina and settled in a little cave one and one half miles east of the springs, and in 1820 was built the first cabin.

In the late twenties, the property was bought by Mr. Harris and Mr. Perine who built a splendid hotel right near the springs, and it was not long until Blount Springs became a noted summer resort, and was patronized by the people of the South.

In the early forties, the property was sold to a Mr. George Goff, a wealthy New Yorker, who planted mulberry trees along what is now known as the Mulberry Prong of the Warrior River. The river took its name from this project of Mr. Goff. As soon as the mulberry trees were large enough, Mr. Goff placed millions of silk worms on these trees and started a silk factory at Blount Springs.

The silk industry was a failure (so was Mr. Goff), and in a few years the property was sold under mortgage and bought by Parrish and Company of New York. The property remained in their hands until bought by J.F.B. Jackson in 1876.

The hotel, which had already been started, was burned in 1866. When J.F.B. Jackson bought the property, he built another and in 1878, built a large one. In the later eighties, Mr. Jackson sold the property to the Sloss Company of Birmingham, Al. In 1895 Blount Springs was again
