

I know all men by these presents
that I, Harrieh S. Colyar of
Fancy City, Grundy County, Tenn
am, being of sound mind and
disposing memory, do make and
publish this my last will and
testament, hereby revoking all
former wills by me at any time
heretofore made.

And as to my worldly estate, and all
the property, real, personal or mixed
of which I shall die seized and
possessed or to which I shall be
entitled at the time of my decease
I devise, bequeath and dispose
thereof in the manner following
to wit:

First: My will is that all my just
debts and funeral expenses shall
be by my executors, hereinafter named,
to be paid out of my estate as soon
after my decease as shall by them
be found convenient.

Second: After paying my just debts
& funeral expenses as aforesaid it
is my will that all the remainder
of my property of every kind & char-
acter or the proceeds thereof shall

or equally divided among my chil-
dren surviving at the time of my de-
cease, and any of my children not
surviving at the time of my death but
who shall have surviving them
any child or children then such
children shall be entitled to the
share or part of my estate to which
he, her or their parent would
have been entitled to if he or she
had been surviving at the time
of my decease.

3^d I do nominate and appoint my
sons, Lewis S. Colyar and George J.
Colyar to be executors of this my
last will & testament, and they
are released from giving any bond
being any surety or making
any report to Court of their ad-
ministration of this trust. They
are hereby vested with full
power & authority to sell any
part or sale of my estate as in
their judgment they may think
best for the beneficiaries under
this will and divide the proceeds
thereof among them in accordance
with

With the second clause of this
Will. In the event of the death
of either one of my said Executors
then the survivor shall act and
have the same rights & powers as
herin vested in both of them.
