do make and declare this to be my
Last Will & Testament.

1st I bequeath to my son, William Perry

including about two hundred acres,

for me during my natural life.

2nd I hereby bequeath and direct that
that my son William, pay to each
of my children, to wit S. M. Perry,
Jane King & Nellie Burrus the sum
of five dollars each as their portion
of my estate.

3rd All my personal property of what-
ever description I bequeath to my
son William.

I hereby appoint S. A. Judson my
Executor without bond.
