Ex parte Application for Citizenship

This cause coming on to be heard before the
Hon M. R. Smallman Judge C, and it appearing to the
satisfaction of the Court that petitioner had declared
on oath before the Circuit Court of Grundy County Tenn.
his intention of becoming a citizen of the United States
and that the petitioner Rubble had made application for
his first papers more than two years since, and had
taken the necessary oath entitling him to said first papers
and that said application & oath were made and taken in
this Court more than two years ago, and it further
appearing that through negligence or oversight of the Clerk
of said Court said first papers were not issued said petitioner
as the law directs, and that he has been a resident of the State
of Tennessee more than five years past, and it further
appearing to the Court from the proof, that the petitioner
during that time has behaved himself as a man of good
moral character, and that he is attached to the principles of
the Constitution of the United States, and having renounced
all allegiance to all foreign potentates and powers, and
having taken an oath to support the Constitution of the
United States and of the State of Tennessee, It is therefore
ordered adjudged and decreed by the Court that the said
Charles Rubble be and he is entitled and admitted to all
the right, title and privileges therunto belonging, and that
he pay the cost of this application
