

Last Will and Testament of
William C. Shipp

S. W. S.

I, William Shipp of Tracy City Tennessee
being now of sound mind and
disposing memory, and recollecting
the interesting life, and the
certainty of death, and desiring
to dispose of all my earthly
possessions in seemly and best
shew by make and publish this
my last will and testament
hereby revoking and annulling
void all former wills by me at
any time made,

1st I desire that all my just
debts and funeral expenses be
paid by my Executor to be hereafter
named, so soon as practicable after
my decease, out of any moneys or
effects that I may then possess
of

2nd I will and desire that the
house & lot upon which I now
reside, be reserved to my wife

Amanda Stepp, and my little
daughter Lucy Pearl Stepp, with
the balance due on said house
& lot shall have been paid to
the Grancy Building & Loan

Association at Tracy City &
desire that my Expenses pay said
remainder out of debts due
me as a partner in the firm
of W. C. Stepp & Sons, Riverman.

3^d The residue of my property of
every description, and whatsoever I may
desire to be divided into three
equal portions, And divided as
follows. To my said wife Amanda
Stepp, and little daughter Lucy
Pearl Stepp. One third, To my
son J. H. Stepp. One third, and
to my son A. M. Stepp the remaining
third.

4 I have four other children to wit -
Audiee Thompson, wife of F. C. Thompson
Hollie Campbell, wife of Andy
Campbell, Fannie Cowan, wife of
L. L. Cowan, and J. C. Stepp, the
reason that I do not see proper to
bequeath anything to these four

Moved. This is because, that
they have never assisted me, and
have not treated me in the
deserving manner due from children
to parents. While my wife Amanda
& little daughter Edna Park, and
H.W. & F.M. Stepp, the said two
named sons, have all ever been kind-
& affectionate, and have assisted me
in whatever I have had to possess except
I desire, that two years after my death
that my executor pay to Leslie
Campbell the sum of twenty dollars
in money.

Third Lastly, reposing full faith in
the honesty and integrity of my son
H.M. Stepp, I do nominate and
appoint him my executor to this my
will and testament, and release
him of the necessity of executing bond
as such, which I hereby expressly waive
Given under my hand, April 24th 1899
