Kilgore; R. E. (probably B. E.) alias Bud Street; Jane who married John Cannon; Lennie who married James Vaughn; Ella who married _____; Lula who married Jack Hargis; all of whom are now living in Tracy City, except Bud Street, who lives on this farm in Coffee County. John Street also left Martha who married John Cannon and was his first wife. Martha died about 7 years ago last May and left as her only children, Sam and Margia Cannon, who are 11 and 8 years of age. They live with their father, John Cannon, in Tracy City.
