ISAAC E. WALKER 4 NOV 1862

I Isaac E. Walker, do this day publish this, as my last will and testament, first, I request, that my personal expenses and all my just debts, be paid out of any money, that I may die possessed of, or may first come into the hands of my Administrator, secondly, I give and bequeath to my Brother, Francis M. Walker, my half of the Land, that my Father Jeremiah Walker, dec'd. will or give to me, in his life time, also my half, of the Still and tubbs, Thirdly, I give, and bequeath to Winny Groce, my Negro Woman & Slave, for life time, after her death to her second daughter Francis Groce — Fourthly, I give and bequeath my Negro Boy Valentine, to Isaac Groce, son of Mrs. Groce Fifthly I give, daughter of William Groce, and bequeath to Nathayam Groce, my Negro Girl Talu, — Sixthly I give and bequeath to Sally Groce daughter of Mrs. Groce the third daughter, my Negro Girl, Nancy Ann Seventhly — I give and bequeath to my Aunt Polly Brown, and Aunt Jane Brown, and my sister Martha etcher, and my sister Nancy Milligan, an Adm'tor. Post, Fifty dollars a piece in Money if there is enough, left after my debts, are paid, and if there is not enough, for them each to have the Fifty dollars a piece then what is left if any to be equally divided with them, all, and lastly, all my other property to be sold for the purposes before stated whereunto I do this day set my hand, and seal this the 4th day of November 1862
