ISAAC E. WALKER 4 NOV 1862

I do now & this day publish this, as my last will and instrument, first, I request, that my personal expenses and all my just debts, be paid out of any money, that I may die possessed of, or may first come into the hands of my administrator. Secondly, I give and bequeath to my Brother, Francis M. Walker, my half of the Land, that my Father Leoniude Walker, deas<sup>t</sup> will or give to me, in his life time, also my half, of the Still and Tubs, Thirdly, I give, and bequeath to Wm<sup>g</sup> Groce, my Negro Woman Eliza, for life time, after her death to his second daughter Anna Groce — Fourthly, I give and bequeath my Negro Boy Valentine, to Isa Groce, son of Mr. Groce Fifthly I give, daughter of William Groce, and bequeath to Ruthayam Groce, my Negro girl Tabie, — Sixthly I give and bequeath to Sally Groce daughter of Mr. Groce the third daughter, my Negro girl, Nancy etm Seventy — I give and bequeath to my Aunt Polly Browne and Aunt Jane Brown, and my sister Martha etc<sup>t</sup>, and any sister Nancy Willey, and adonah Bost, Fifty dollars a piece in Money if there is enough, left after any debts, are paid, and if there is not enough, for them each to have the Fifty dollars apiece then what is left if any to be equally divided with them, all, and lastly, all other property to be sold for the purpose before State wherunto I do this day set my hand, and seal this the 4<sup>th</sup> day of November 1862.
